and knowing that death is thine to come at some time make this my  
last will and testament in words following that is to say  
That after my decease my property herein named be divided  
As follows

At I loan to my two daughters Alvin E. McKain and  
Clarenda Garrison during their natural life and give the same  
 to their heirs <sup>at</sup> ~~no farther~~ beginning the following described land  
 Beginning at a stake on the east side of the branch Canal running  
 that way along a ditch to M. A. Kells thence South westerly  
 along his line to the corner thence South 65 West with the ditch to the  
 creek thence up said Canal northward to the beginning  
 And I loan to my daughter Caroline Mason and give to her  
 heirs at her death the following piece of land beginning at the same  
 place of the above and running up the Canal northwardly to a ditch  
 thence easterly with the ditch straight to the street thence  
 southerly to Monroe Garrison corner thence easterly to Holton  
 Adams line thence South with Adams and Kells line to Alvin  
 E. McKain and Clarenda Garrison line thence Westwardly with  
 their line to the beginning inclosing the house and premises  
 on which I now live

and I loan to my son Monroe Farmer and give to his heirs  
the following described land beginning at a stake and ditch  
the upper corner of Caroline Masons land running up said land  
the stake thence east a crop the street to Holland Adams line thence  
southwely to Monroe Farmers line thence westerly with said  
line a crop the street to Caroline Masons line and along her  
line to the beginning.

With I give to my three grand children the heirs of my daughter Elizabeth Mellis die at the following piece of land to be in the care of my executor here after named untill they become twenty one years old beginning on the side of the Canal at A Stake Thence <sup>from</sup> running Northwesterly up

the Canal to the mouth of Cropper branch thence up  
Main run of Shoe branch until an easterly cross  
enclose all of the Swamp of Cropper branch thence  
easterly to the Street or road thence southerly to the  
Garnier line and with his line easterly to the  
beginning

5th I leave to my son Nathaniel Garnier and at his  
death give to his heirs the following piece of land  
beginning in Monroe Garnier corner on the east side  
of of the Street and running northward along said  
or road a crop Cropper branch thence easterly to the  
Bell line thence southerly with said Bells and Hallow  
Adams line to Monroe Garnier line and thence westward  
along his line to the beginning

6th I leave to all of my children the following piece  
piece of land in common stock for the privilege of fire  
and Rail timber and other necessary buildings during  
life and growth same to their children at their death  
follows Beginning in Shoe branch near the upper end  
of the line of my Daughter Elizabeth Hill's tract and  
running up the road a crop Shoe branch thence  
easterly to the Street or road thence leading southerly  
from Taylor line thence easterly to Channel C. Garnier's  
thence along his line to the Nicol Bell patent line thence  
southerly to N. Garnier line thence westward along  
the Street and along his line to the beginning

7th The balance of my land consisting of the following  
viz the Abston Island the Hebbes and the balance of  
Taylor Land as my papers for the same will more fully  
show I leave in the hands of my executors with the  
privilege of using or selling anything off said land for  
Cash on hand to be applied to my estate for the use of all  
of my heirs

8th the balance of my personal property consisting of  
household and kitchen furniture farming tools  
stock of all kinds and all of my mechanical tools

together with all of my personal estate I leave in the  
hands of my executors to sell for cash and pay all of my  
just debts and expenses of every kind and then divide the  
balance equally among my heirs

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved children  
Philemon H. Garnier, Caroline Mason Francis Mason  
and Monroe Garnier my lawful executors to execute this  
my last will and testament according to the true intent and  
meaning of the same in witness whereof I the said Dexter G.  
Garnier do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 23rd day  
of May 1888
