Elizab I have here mentioned, This is my last Will and
Testament, I leave many more Executrix and good to
Exposty, Whereof we have heareats at our hands this Twenty
Third day of March 1793.

I give and Request unto my loving son Taylor Nelson the Land where
I now live containing sevral acres at my death only excepting my
loving wife to have her share for life. Also I give and Request
unto my loving daughter Vorlae Nelson my self feather bed and
furniture.

I also I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Nelson all the rest of my
Estate during her life and without any other estate to her
Equally divided among all my children I do appoynt my loving
wife and Elizabeth Nelson and Edmund Nelson joint Executrix
to this my last Will and Testament.
