 my last will and testament hereby
 revoking all former wills by me
 any time heretofore made

First My will and desire is, that all
 my just debts shall be payed out of
 my personal estate by my Executors
 hereinafter named

Second- I give devise and bequeath to my beloved
 wife Della Doyle and my son Edward
 Owen Doyle all my real estate and
 personal property, of every kind and description
 the same to be held in trust for the
 use and benefit by the persons herein
 named and as hereinafter directed

Third I hereby constitute and appoint my
 friend J. B. Jones of Beaufort N.C. my
 cousin Edward P. Carroll of New
 and my sister-in-law Miss Florence

Lamar Trustees of my Estate and guardian
 and of my said son, and the said estate
 shall be vested in and remain in their pos-
 session and control for the purpose hereinafter
 mentioned.

Further The said J. B. Jones, Edward P. Carroll
 and Miss Florence Lamar are hereby au-
 thorized and directed, as soon after my decease
 as convenient to invest all of my personal
 property in such manner, as they may
 deem best (Except cash household and kitchen
 furniture as may be necessary for the comfort
 and well being of my said wife and child)
 and the interest and profit arising therefrom,
 the said Trustees shall expend for the support
 and maintenance of my said wife and son
 and his education, but should said Trustee
 deem the said interest and profit inadequate for
 their support they may expend so much of the principal
 money as they may think necessary for that purpose.
 After the death of my wife, my will and desire
 is that all of my said property shall devolve
 to and vest in my said son, Edward Owen Doyle
 and when he arrives at the age of twenty one
 years, the said Trustees shall deliver and pay
 the same to him.

Should said son die without lawful
 issue (after the death of his mother) my will
 and desire is that all of my said property
 shall vest in said Trustees and their suc-
 cessors as hereinafter provided and the
 rents, profits and interest on the same
 shall be expended by them as follows
 first in keeping my lot or lots in St Pauls
 Church Cemetery in the town of Beaufort N.C.
 in good order for all time, and

annually after the same necessary has been expended on said lot or lots the balance of said rent, profit and interest shall be paid to the County Treasury of said County to be expended by the legal authorities of said County for the benefit of poor as long as said Estate shall

Seventh. Should either of said Trustees die or fail or refuse to act as such, my will and desire is that the Clerk of Superior Court of Castlet County North Carolina shall appoint one or more not to exceed Trustees to take charge of my said estate with the same powers and duties as are prescribed and given to J. B. Jones, Edw. P. Carroll and Florence Garner and the Trustees so appointed die the said Clerk is hereby authorized to appoint another or others, so that there may always be a Trustee in charge of said estate, so long as it may be necessary to carry out the true intent of this my last will and testament.

Eighth My will and desire is that J. B. Jones, Edw. P. Carroll and Florence Garner shall be allowed to act as Trustees as herein provided without bonds.

Nine My will and desire is that my Son, Edward, Owen Doyle be named in the Roman Catholic Church when he comes of age, he can choose for himself.

Ten I give and bequeath to my son Edward Owen Doyle my gold watch and chain in case of his death it will go to my Cousin Edward P. Carroll

My late wife's watch will go to Maggie Jones and be worn by her in remembrance of the lady she was named for. Provided that my present wife is not living. In testimony whereof I Edward Doyle hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of November 1895.
