 divided among my three Children namely my beloved daughter
 my beloved daughter Sarah my beloved daughter Elizabeth
 my beloved daughter Mary my beloved daughter Sarah and also I give
 and bequeath unto my beloved wife during this life and after her death
 no more worth her I give and bequeath unto my three children
 Sarah Elizabeth and Mary and whereon my dwelling house and
 all other appurtenances thereunto belonging and further I
 observe that the land I give unto my beloved daughter Sarah
 land or parcel of land whereon my dwelling house now stands
 and after my beloved wife shall depart this life I will that all
 my house hold furniture shall be divided equally between
 my three children as above named. I do hereby and by virtue
 of this my last will and Testament appoint for my Executors my beloved
 William O'Neal and my beloved son in law James H. Barnard.
