In the name of God, amen, I Thomas Morris of the County of Berkeley  
and State of N. Carolina, being weak in body and considering the  
faintness of this life, yet of sound mind and memory, do make and  
publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form  
following, that is to say, First I recommend my body to be buried in  
a Christian like manner, and my soul to God who gave it.  
Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Patsy Hill,  
all my effects and debts active and passive, with all my  
real and personal estate, Household and kitchen furniture,  
after paying my just debts to be possessed by her during her  
life, and after her death to be distributed among my heirs.

I also hereby appoint my beloved wife Patsy Hill, the  
executrix to this my last will and testament, hereby  
revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seal this 4th day of February in the year of our  
Lords one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.

In the name of God, amen,  
I know all men by these presents that I, Isaac Hill, late of this  
County in body but of sound mind and memory, think to be to God  
for the same (do this 16th day of December in the year of our  
Lords one thousand eight hundred and fourteen) make  
and declare this my last will and testament, in manner follow-  
ing, to wit, - My will is that all my movable estate to be sold  
except what I will away to my lawful heirs, -

1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Patsy Hill,  
two mules her choice, my partial horse, big & mares, this  
I give as a loan her natural life, and then to my daughter  
Sudama Hill, her heirs & assigns for ever.

I loan to my wife Patsy Hill - during her life, six negroes  
namely - Betsy, Benjamin, Sarah, Dinah, Rachel & Peter, and  
after her death all these negroes and their increase to go to  
my two daughters Pamelia Hill & Sudama Hill equally  
divided between the two, to them, their heirs and assigns for ever.

I give my wife Patsy Hill two cows & furniture, six  
sows & pigs, six head of cattle, haws & haws one run of oxen,  
Twelve head of sheep, to her her heirs & assigns for ever, also  
one half of my house hold & kitchen furniture, to her, her heirs  
and assigns for ever.

I loan to my wife Patsy Hill one third of my Cedar Pond Plan-  
tation during her natural life, and then to my sons Hated and  
Joy Hill, their heirs and assigns for ever.

2nd I give my son John Hill the land and house which  
he now has in his possession also a right in my fishing place  
during his life and after his death to Hated & Joy Hill, their  
heirs and assigns for ever and Edward Hill's.

3rd I give to my son William Hill or his heirs as he is now  
deceased, the land they live on, and three negroes Eglar's,  
Grace & Catharine, also one yoke of oxen, to him and his  
heirs and assigns forever.

4th I give my daughter Polly forty Dollars in cash - to her  
heirs & assigns for ever.

5th I give my son Buckner Hill one house & lot in  
the Town of Swainsboro and a slave girl money, to him his  
heirs and assigns for ever.

6th I give my son Hated Hill one half of my Cedar Pond  
Plantation, after his mother's death, and one third before,  
to him, his heirs and assigns forever, his share of the whole  
Plantation, also his part of slaves to his part.

7th I give my son Lucas Hill his equal part of all my  
slaves, to him his heirs & assigns for ever.

9<sup>th</sup> I give my son *Isaac* this one half of my Plantations here  
 Point after his mother's death and one third before, also his  
 equal part of slaves - To him his share and assigns for ever.  
 10<sup>th</sup> I give my son *Edward* this all my River Land and the  
 Land to him his share and assigns forever also his equal  
 part of my slaves - To him his share & assigns for ever.  
 11<sup>th</sup> I give my daughter *Pamela* this her equal part of my  
 slaves, to her her share and assigns for ever, also as much  
 to buy a horse and to him out of my perishable estate and  
 feather Bed and furniture - To her share & assigns for ever.  
 12<sup>th</sup> I give my daughter *Didama* this her equal part of all  
 my slaves, to her her share & assigns for ever, one feather bed  
 and furniture - To her share & assigns for ever, and in her lot of  
 slaves I wish she should have a negro girl by the name of  
 Andy - and my daughter one by the name of Sally is my  
 daughter *Pamela* this, all my other River Land to my son  
 Hatch & my wife their share & assigns for ever - also each of  
 my sons Hatch, Isaac, Isac, Isac & Edward one feather bed & furniture.  
 I give my son Isac one Yoke of Oxen and the share by the  
 Statesman, to his share & assigns for ever.

I give my son *Isaac* this my Sweetest horse and as much  
 money as will buy him an elegant chain & harness, to him  
 his share & assigns for ever.

after my wife's death my wife's Land to my daughter *Didama*  
 this her share & assigns for ever and after all my debts are paid  
 if there are any money left to be divided between my children  
 Hatch this, Isaac this, Isac this, Pamela this, *Didama* this  
 and *Edward* this, their share & assigns for ever -

I give my son *Isaac* this one of my slave boys as a witness  
 gratis for his attendance on me - by the name of *Isaac*.  
 Lastly I nominate and appoint my sons *John* & *Isaac*  
 Hatch this and *Isaac* this my sole executors to this my  
 last will and testament disallowing and disannulling  
 all former wills by me made, Ratifying and Confirming  
 this my last will and testament as by me signed the  
 testator, The day & date first first above written.  
 I here sign my hand affix my seal - this November 16<sup>th</sup>  
 1814.

I give my son *Edward* & *Isaac* one Lot of land on  
 my back Point Plantations between my last will

and if he dies without a lawful heir this Property to go to  
 my son *Isaac* this, his mother,  
 also one part of my salt works to *Isaac* and if he dies with-  
 out an heir to Hatch this and if Hatch or my wife dies  
 without an heir or lawe Legatee of their body, this Property to go  
 to my son *Isaac* this.
