Now the name of Isaac Gible, I declare herein of Guilford North Carolina, being of sound weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory. I give to the effect of this my last will and testament in manner following, first, after the settlement of all my debts and the collection of my claims as far as can be collected in the time prescribed by law.

It is my request that my negroes shall be liberated provided they are willing to go to Liberia in Africa, if not they are to be sold of in the same manner as the balance of my real and personal property, with one exception herein after named

secondly I give and bequeath unto my Mother Rebecca Gible one fourth part of all my real and personal property for natural life and after her decease I wish it to be equally divided among the heirs of my sister Francis and Mary Kanaday, the one of whom is deceased, thirdly, I give and bequeath unto William Lang and my nephew one fourth part of all my real and personal property provided that he in case one from the payment of debts which I give him in Raleigh for the amount of fifteen hundred dollars, fourthly, I give and bequeath unto my wife Charity

and my heirs or heirs of any or the heirs of my decease the balance of my real and personal property, to be equally divided among them and after my wife's decease, it is my request that the amount of property that I have bequeathed to her, shall again return to my nearest relations, in the disposal of my negroes, the except one alluded to above is, that provided my negro man Robert, will not go to Liberia in Africa, he shall become the sole property of Isaac Kanaday, son of Isaac & Francis Kanaday, and provided that he dies before he arrives to the age of twenty one years, Robert, shall be disposed of after the same manner as the rest of my property - In conclusion, In consideration of the return made for William J. Langdon, I do hereby constitute, and appoint him my sole executor, to this my last will and testament; and I do hereby invest him with full power and authority to take possession of my property and dispose of it in the manner prescribed by this my last will and testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal

In the Name of God Amen I Sen and Mann of County of Carteret and State of North Carolina being this time in my proper senses Make and ordain this last Will and Testament in order and manner, following I give and recommend my self into the hands of Almighty God that you it and my body to be decently laid in the earth at the discretion of my Executors -

Firstly I give to my son Elijah Mann all that parcel lying to the South of John Wakes Lane called in the partition to him & his heirs, Secondly, I give to my son Thomas Mann my lands on the South side of Newport called the Langstaff to him and his heirs except that my son John Mann is to have the privilege to mine the turpentine trees that is New land as long as they are fit to mine and no longer

Thirdly I give to my daughter Felony, Garm and Gemina Garm a piece of land in the fork of Newport on the South side of a small branch to the West of my plantation where the the Germanish Garm now lives also that set of ground the the Pelmeton Islands with in the limits that the said Garm Cleams to him and his heirs, fourthly I give to my sons William & Jasper Mann my hanna and plantation with all adjoining land on the east side of the aforesaid branch in the fork of Newport River, also all the ballance of the plantation Island lava to them & their heirs -

I ordain and constitute the five Children I have by my

Wife namely Mrs. Anne William Mary Ann Jasper Mann my lawful heirs with the gift a few mentioned I give to my son Sen my shot gun and bills and small Chest I give to my daughter Eunice one feather bed with one fourth part of all the bead furniture on bedstead also one Chest I give to my son William Garm one feather bed with one fourth part of all the bead furniture on table -

I give to my daughter Mary Ann one feather bed, and one fourth part of all the bead furniture I give to my son Jasper one feather bed & one fourth part of bead furniture, I desire that my son John Mann, take the five

mentioned Children under his Care and keep them if convenient to look them good homes as he can then goes to go with them and the provisions on hand and growing all cloths not made

clothes to be put to clothe the said Children I desire that they have some education, I give my possession, appert to my sons John and Elijah all the property I have or other wise mentioned

to be sold at Six months Credit and the money arising to pay my Just debts and funeral Charges and expenses being from the small Children unless the youngest surviving Child have a wife at ten Years Old then if any thing remain to be

equally divided between Sarah Adams, Thomas Martin, Sen John, Eunice Mann, William Mann, Mary Ann, Mann, and Jasper Mann, Lastly I appoint my son John Mann executor of this my last will and Testament; and that he be paid for all

debts and expenses
