3rd, I leave and bequeath also to my wife Patsy Gillet, \$400⁰⁰ (four hundred dollars) in money to be placed at interest in some good bank, and to be paid to her in annual installments of fifty dollars, until the same, with interest, shall be drawn.

4th. I also give to my wife my house and out-houses, house hold and kitchen furniture, corn, fodder, peas, potatoes, hogs, poultry, & farming implements.

5th. I also give and bequeath to my dear brother Hilliard Gordon, the 3rd. choice cow and calf, & also a Rifle.

6th. I also give and bequeath to my dear daughter, Mary Gillet, the 2nd. choice cow and calf, and also \$10. (ten dollars) in money.

7th. I give to my wife one gun and one pistol.

8th. I do hereby make and declare Parker Whittington, of the County of Carteret and State of North Carolina, the Executor of this my last will and testament.
