and in the Province of North-Carolina Being very
sick and weak in Body but of a perfect mind
and memory sheweth he gives to almighty God
for the same Therefore calling to mind the mortality
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for
all Men or women once to die do make and
ordain this to be my last-will and Testament that
is to say first and principally of all I Recommend
my Soul in to Hands of almighty God I shew
it and nothing Doubting but at the general Res-
urrection I shall Receive the same again by the
mighty power of God and my Body to be Buried in
a Christian like and Decent Burial at Discretion
of Executors and as touching all such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
me in this life I give and Dispose of the same
in the following manner and form I do leave my
land to be Equald a Divided betwene three
of my children Isaac and Saviour and John
my plantation wherof now lies I gave to
to my son John and the herb of my wife
Dunn her life and then to be Equald a
Divided amonst the rest of my children Estab-
tain Elizabeth and Leah and Saviour and
my Dorat Elizabeth I do cut her off with
down Shilling I do nominate and appoint
my wife and son Isaac and John Smith to
be my whole and Sole Executors of this my
last-will and Testament

In the name of God Amen.

I James Bell of Caswell-County in the State of
North-Carolina, being weak of body but of sound and
disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this
to be my last-will and Testament; and as concerning
my outward estate I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form

First I leave unto my beloved wife Rebecca Bell the
use of all my estate both real and personal only such
part of the land that my two sons hereinafter named
may choose to settle upon and such priviledges thereunto
on the land as may be thought by judicious men to be re-
quisite for them during her natural life.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Bell one
half of all the lands wherem I now live to be divided in
the following manner to begin on ^(Northward) Hartwells Creek and
run a straight line to the base line then this my son
is to have the part which is the most North westerly
to whom I give the same and to his heirs and assigns for
ever and ever and the other half of the same I give and
bequeath to my wife Rebecca Bell for her life and after her
decease to be equally divided amongst all my children

My will and desire is further is that if
my said wife can help any of my children at any time
hereafter to anything she can spare for their use that
she may do, and keep account of the value thereof which
is to be accounted as a part of the share of each of
them who may so have received anything of her after my
decease. And after the decease of my said wife I give and
bequeath all my personal estate to be equally divided
amongst all my children

Lastly I nominate and appoint my said beloved wife
Rebecca Bell Executrix and my son William Bell
Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
and annulling all former wills by me at any time her-
etofore made, ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last-will and Testament this twenty fourth day
of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven
hundred and Ninety Seven 1797.
