unto my beloved wife two negroes Peter and Flora with
all the Rest of the household furniture that come to her by
Intermarriage to her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

And also all the Rest of my negroes horses cattle hogs
household furniture and kitchen furniture and plantation
tools I leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth during her
Natural life then after her death I give and bequeath said
property with increase to my beloved Brother Lebeus
Hunter to him and his heirs and assigns for ever.

I do hereby appoint my loving friends Lebeus
Hunter and Samuel Davis Executors to this my last
Will and Testament. Given under my hand and
seal Novr 20th 1807.

of sound mind and memory Thanks be given to all mighty God
therefore, knowing its once appointed for all men to die I do make
this my last will and Testament. This in manner and form fol-
lowing. Principally at a first of all I recommend my soul into
the hands of God who gave it and my body to be buried in the midst
of the earth in a decent and Christian like manner.

My will is that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid
then I will to Joseph Gouman fifty acres of land & share on
the new river joining Jacobson's hearthstone him to have and his heirs forever.
Then I will to Belcher Harker fifty acres of land & his heirs for ever.
Then I will to Hannah Bostery my manner plantation whereon
I now live to her and her heirs forever.

Then I will to Jane Gouman fifty acres of land joining my manner
plantation to her and her heirs for ever.

Then I will to Cate Mumford one hundred acres of land to be
laid off to her at the discretion of my executors.

Then I will to Cate Mumfords child who now lives with me fifty
acres land joining his mothers. -

Since that Peter and Jerry should be at liberty after my death to do for
themselves, as they have served me faithful for many years, I leave them
in the care of my Executors and do hereby request of the honorable Court of
Barlert to give them for there many services done for me. Then I will
to Cate Mumford who now lives with me as a servant girl one bed and
bed with the furniture that is now in the hands of Bakery Run. I order
that what I have not all ready mention that my executors will attend to
at the law my direct. I do hereby acknowledge this to be my last
will and Testament Resolving all others I do have, from my friend
Freeman Ellis and Jozeph Read my executors. I hereunto sign my
hand and seal this the first day of December the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Betty Hill all my effects and debts active and passive, with all my real and personal estate, Household and Kitchen furniture, after paying my just debts to be possessed by her during her natural life, and after her death to be distributed among my heirs.

I also hereby appoint my beloved wife Betty Hill to be executrix to this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In the name of God, amen, I know all men by these presents that I, Isaac Hill, late with being weak in body but of sound mind and memory, do make and publish for the same (do this 16th day of December in the year of our Lords one thousand eight hundred and fourteen) all that and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner following, that is to say, I give and bequeath all my real estate, with all my effects and debts active and passive, with all my real and personal estate, Household and Kitchen furniture, after paying my just debts to be possessed by her during her natural life, and after her death to be distributed among my heirs.

2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Betty Hill, two mules her choice, my partial horse, big & mares, this I give as a loan her natural life, and then to my daughter Sidama Hill, her heirs & assigns for ever.

I loan to my wife Betty Hill - during her life, six negroes - namely - Betsy, Benjamin, Sarah, Dinah, Rachel & Peter, and after her death all these negroes and their increase to go to my two daughters Pamellie Hill & Sidama Hill equally divided between the two, to them, their heirs and assigns for ever.

I give my wife Betty Hill two cows & furniture, six Sows & Pigs, six head of cattle, two & two one pair of Oxen, Twelve head of sheep, to her her heirs & assigns for ever, also one half of my House hold & Kitchen furniture, to her, her heirs and assigns for ever.

I loan to my wife Betty Hill one third of my Cedar Pond Plantation during her natural life, and then to my sons Hated and Jay Hill, their heirs and assigns for ever.

3rd I give my son John Hill the land and house which he now has in his possession also a right in my fishing place during his life and after his death to Hated & Jay Hill, their heirs and assigns for ever and Edward Hill.

4th I give to my son William Hill or his heirs as he is now deceased, the land they live on, and three negroes Gabriel, Grace & Catharine, also one yoke of Oxen, to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

5. I give my daughter Polly forty Dollars in cash - to her her heirs & assigns for ever.

6th I give my son Buckner Hill one house & lot in the Town of Swainsboro and a Slave Girl money, to him his heirs and assigns for ever.

7th I give my son Hated Hill one half of my Cedar Pond Plantation, after his mother death, and one third before, to him, his heirs and assigns forever, his share of the whole Plantation, also his part of slaves to his part.

8th I give my son Sonas Hill his equal part of all my slaves, to him his heirs & assigns for ever.
