Second - My wife Elizabeth J. Guchrie shall have the use of my homestead

farm of twenty five (25) acres and all other property, personal and real, including the rents of the Quallow County farm) left after my funeral expenses and just debts are satisfied and all goods, chattels, or other personal property upon said estate, not otherwise provided for shall be under her full control and devoted solely to her own use and disposition during her natural life.

After the death of my wife Elizabeth Gutherie, I gave and bequeathed to my youngest son John H. Gutherie, the east end of my Homestead farm beginning at a Lightwood Stake east of the base fence on the line between said farm and Jacob H.
