to Jack - also - Mrs. Hill.

Item, my Desire is after all my just debts
is paid, whatever remains, I give two thirds
to John Hill and one third to Jack Hill
and Lastly I nominate my Loving friend
John Hill Executor to this my Last will and
Testament - Signed & Sealed in the presence

That I John Hill of said County and State
Planted being weaker in body but perfect in mind do
make and confirm this my Last Will and Testament
first I give my soul to God and secondly I give to my
son Jonathan Hills one mare named fair and thirdly
I keep all the Rest of my Property to my beloved wife
Elizabeth Hills for her use and to enjoy it her life
and to raise the children and at her decease one fourth
to my daughter Anne Hills and one fourth to
my daughter Lidy Hills and the Rest of my property
to be equally amongst my children as witnesses my
hand this third day of December annos 1799
