wife and devise that if any of my sons should die or daughter dies  
they come to age or cannot bear their Land be divided among the  
sons and black ales and Likewise the kids Estate in like manner  
the girls and further this is my will and devise that at the death of my  
beloved wife or marriage all the above mentioned black ales  
which I have given before to her to be Equally divided among all  
my children. Lastly I nominate my son John Oglesby and  
Nathan Bell Executors of this my last will and Testamant in  
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the same  
Eighth of December 1796.

In the name of god our saviour John Oglesby of the County of Orange in the  
State of North Carolina being every week and day out of prison  
for sum of three and twenty days owing to service the mortality of  
my Body being it so appointed to all men to let us take and speak  
this my last will and Testament in manner and form as  
followeth First of all I Commit my soul into the hands of Almighty  
god that first gave it and my Body to the dust from whence it  
came desiring for free pardon for all my sins through Jesus  
Christ my redeemer. Secondly my Body to be decently buried  
in a Christian like manner. Thirdly my will and devise is that  
all my just debts to be first paid. I now give as follows First I  
Leave unto my loving wife during her natural life the use of my  
maner plantation wherein I now live I also give her my one wife  
three Tudder Beads and Turnites then being the same that I had by her  
but also I give her one horse mare named the same that I had by her  
also I give her my said wife three Cowrie peint pole beads and  
Coot and shee shee yearlings and one Cow named Nellie and her  
Calf and one Cow named Cheery and her Calf also three Breeding  
horses which she is to have chuse of all my stock of hogs except  
them already given away all of the above articles and things men-  
tioned given to my wife I give and bequeath unto her and her  
heirs assign forever more.

I also leave to be allotted out of my stock of hogs as many of the best of  
them as will when full grown make twelve hundred weight for the purpose  
of my family the ensuing year also I leave the use of my team  
and Ox Cart and the choice of my stock to take two young Hogs  
to Brak for plantation you jointly between my wife and my  
two sons Daniel and John Oglesby which said Daniel and  
Hans and Carte I give unto my wife Nancy Oglesby Daniel  
and John Oglesby to their and their Heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Oglesby all  
that piece of Land that I bought of Benjamin Oglesby lying on the  
North side of hills swamp Containing one hundred and Fifty  
acres the same more or less also I give him said Dan's Oglesby  
all the lands I own lying on the south side of Newpost River more  
or less none by the name of Oglesby Neck being part of a tract  
patented by Ephrem Chadwick also I give him one hundred acres  
of land lying on the south side of Newpost River near the source  
now being the same that my father gave me in his last will and  
testament. also I give him the fifty acres of land adjoining the  
same which I took up and patented. I also give him my said  
son Daniel one sonal Mar named Sam But I leave at the  
privilege of the Colle to suck her until the said Colle is over  
his life, also I give him two Tudder Beads and furniture etc

all the Cattle that is now dead or a muck which is burnt  
Crop and horses but the left year and still in the right are  
all the Hogs in the same mess. all of the above Land and the  
Articles of property I give unto him my said son Daniel Ogley  
for Horses and assigns forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son John Ogley living  
Five acres of Land lying on the North side of Newport River  
near the junction along the Bearin River which I took up and  
patented also I give him my said son John Ogley my  
House and plantation wherein I now live to be his at the  
death of my wife Nancy Ogley supposed to fifty acres more or  
less. I also give him Ninety four acres of land lying on the East  
side of Shells swamp it being the same that I bought of William  
Ogley dead also I give him Seventy five acres of land lying on  
the North side of Shells swamp above the great Branch which  
I took up and patented also I give unto him the Bell that  
belongs to my dear Deceased Dan and one Cow and her Calf  
Nancy that is called his I also give unto my said son to keep  
Beads and Furniture also I give unto my son one Cow and  
Calf and her Calf and his choice of Four Horses aforesaid to  
be take his choice of all my Stock and take Four Horses  
first and all the above mentioned lands and the rest of my  
property I give unto him my said son John Ogley the  
Horses and assigns forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto Francis Barret one Cow named  
Fortune and her Calf and all their issue increase unto her both  
Francis Barret her Horses and assigns forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto Apolis Barret one Cow named  
Susan and her Calf and their issue increase forever which both  
cattle I give unto her and her Horses and assigns forever.

Item I have all my plantation Farming tools to my wife  
Nancy Ogley and my two sons Daniel and John Ogley  
jointly to them for the plantation youse which said tools I give  
and Bequeath unto them Horses and assigns forever.

Item my Will and desire is that my taskill be sold in  
the at publick sale and my Light house that is picked up  
in greatest need to be sold as it lies at publick sale  
by my Executors or Administrators and the purchase is to  
have full Liberty to cut logs and deal materials as is need  
to put them in readiness to burn but there or not shall  
any more on the land than should be needed about the taskill

Item all my Estate now herein mentioned and give  
of every kind or Manner I have to be sold at publick sale  
by my Executors bearing after names mentioned and

the money to pay my just debts out of these Estates so many to my  
wife my debt & then give the balance if any to my son Ogley, otherwise between  
my two sons Daniel and John Ogley to have this done over in joint  
Tenure / Lastly I do ordain nominate make and appointe my Living  
wife Nancy Ogley and church here my executors to this my Last Will  
and Testament acknowledging this to be my last will and Testament -  
in a no other place sealed and published this twenty ninth day of  
June one thousand Eight hundred and eighteen. (1818)
