of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being of sound
mind, do make and establish this my last will and
testament, viz

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife all
lands and Plantations whereon I now live to her & her heirs
and assigns forever. also I give unto her all my household
& Kitchen furniture of all and every kind whatsoever also
all my part of my fishing boat, my canoe & sail, all my
cow-lands, my Oxen & Cows, and farming tools, also all Hops
to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item 2nd I give unto my son-in-law Nicholas Qualey, my
bridle and saddle, also my gun and trap Nets to him & his
heirs and assigns forever.

Item 3rd I give unto my son-in-law Joseph Harris, and his Wife
Mary, Five dollars, to them their heirs and assigns forever.
I appoint my wife my Executrix to this my last will
and testament.

I Josiah Bell of Beaufort North Carolina being of sound
and perfect mind and memory blessed to God for the same
in this the twenty first day of March in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two do make
& publish this my last will and testament in the following
manner. that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my son William J. Bell the
following (negro Slaves, to wit) one Negro woman named
Peggy, and her six Children, and Able, Moses, Mary, Phant and
old Margaret, with their increase, and I also I give unto my
son William J. Bell my Neelot lands, and one half of my
land on North River to have and to hold unto the said William
J. Bell, his heirs and assigns forever the above named Negroes
and lands.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Charity C.
Davis, the following negro Slaves, to wit) Betty, Jacob, Hannah,
David, John, Daniel, Henry, Black Hannah, Dennis, Ned, Edward
and one boy with their increase and also I give unto my
daughter Charity C. Davis my Plantation called the Harris
Plantation and twenty five acres of land that I bought from George
Harris, also that tract of land lying between New Port river
and Hogus Island known by the name of Belle Chapel
to have and to hold unto the said Charity C. Davis her heirs
and assigns forever the above named Negroes & land.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son Josiah J. Bell
the following Negro Slaves to wit,
one Negro Woman named Sarah and four Children, namely
Margaret, Samuel, Martha, Ann and boy, Charles, Isaac, Lewis
Benjamin, Abner, Gray and old Barnab with their increase
and also my House where I now live and premises and one
half of lot no 5 & 6. The Court and one half of my North
River lands and one brass Clock, to have and to hold unto
the said Josiah J. Bell his heirs and assigns forever.
