I have and bear to, and the further considera-

me . I give and devise unto my  
Sister Arlette J. Ellis all of the real estate  
of which I die possessed with all impor-  
tance and privileges attached - also one ox, two  
and household furniture - farm implements  
stocks hogs poultry - and every thing else of  
any description whatsoever and lastly  
I do hereby constitute and appoint my  
friend & Brother James M. Ellis my true  
executor to all intents and purposes  
to execute this my last will and Testament  
according to the true intent and meaning  
the same and every part and clause thereof  
hereby revoking and declaring null and  
void all other wills and Testaments by me  
heretofore made
