

In the Name of God, Amens. I Joseph Gaskill of Dog Island in the County of Carteret and State of N Carolina, being in good Health of Body and of mind and disposing mind and memory, framed this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, and first and principally Commit my soul into the hands of my Creator who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be interred at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and as to such of my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows: that is to say, I order that all my just debts, funeral expenses, and charges growing this my will, be, in the first place fully paid and satisfied, and after payment thereof, and every part thereof, I give and bequeath the House and plantation, with all its improvements heretofore belonging or appertaining situated lying and being on Dog Island aforesaid where I now live, or reside, unto my said wife Mary Gaskill, for and during her natural life; and from and after her decease I give and devise the same to my Grand Son John S. Gaskill (son of Thomas Gaskill, deceased) and his Heirs forever. And I also give to my said wife Mary Gaskill One hundred acres of prime land situated lying & being on Cedar Island in the County and State aforesaid, for her use during her natural life and after her death to my said Grand Son John S. Gaskill and his Heirs forever. I give and bequeath also to my said wife Mary Gaskill for and during her natural life my negro woman Maria and her son named Badger and from and after her decease I give and bequeath the said negro woman Maria & her son Badger to my said Grand Son John S. Gaskill and her Heirs forever.

I also give to my said wife Mary Gaskill during her natural life a Negro Boy named Isaac, and from and after her decease I give and bequeath the said negro (Isaac) to my son

William Gaskill, and his Heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son Loring a negro woman by the name of Phillis to him & his Heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Betty Emery & her heirs forever my negro woman named Major. - I give to my son Noah Gaskill & his Heirs the sum of Two Dollars. - I give to my Daughter Esther Sistren & her heirs the sum of Two Dollars. I give to the other of my Daughters Christian Nelson (dead) the sum of One Dollar. I give to my Daughter Anne Sistren & her heirs One Dollars and fifty Cents. I give to the Heirs of my son Turnfield Gaskill deceased the sum of five Dollars. I give to my son Benjamin Gaskill Two Dollars. I give and devise to my son Joseph Gaskill Twenty five acres of Land laying near the head of Vulture Bay in the County & State aforesaid. I give to my aforesaid wife Mary Gaskill Two feather Beds and furniture to be at her disposal. I give to my Grandson Bennett Gaskill one feather Bed and furniture. I give to my Grand Son Sheridan Emery one feather Bed & furniture all the rest of my Household furniture which I may die possessed of. I give to my aforesaid wife Mary Gaskill during her natural life, and from and after her decease to my Grand Son John S. Gaskill & his Heirs forever. I give to my Grand Son Joseph Gaskill (son of Thomas Gaskill, deceased) the sum of one hundred Dollars, to be laid out in Educating of him, or put out upon Interest payable half yearly until he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years. I give to my Grand daughter Nancy Gaskill (daughter of my son Thomas Gaskill deceased) the sum of one Dollar. I give to my grand son John S. Gaskill my Privilege or Right on the great reef situated lying and being in Pamlico Sound. All the rest of my personal Estate I leave with my Executor (to be hereinafter named) to sell or dispose of as they shall think proper to pay of the legacies &c and the remaining to go to the maintenance of my wife during her natural life, and my three Grand Children orphans of my son Thomas Gaskill deceased, until they shall marry or arrive at the age of Twenty one years.

I also leave my negro man Pompey to be hired out or otherwise disposed of as my Executor may judge most proper for the Maintenance of my wife aforesaid. Three orphans. Until her decease,

and their marriage or arrival at Twenty one years  
as aforesaid. And I do hereby nominate and  
appoint my son William Gaskill, of City Island, and  
my son Louis Gaskill of Cedar Island and City of  
New York. County of Carteret and State of New Jersey  
Executors of this my will. In witness whereof  
the said Testator Joseph Gaskill has hereunto set  
his hand and seal to his last will and Testament set my hand and seal  
the Nineteenth day of January Anno Domini 1826  
and of Our American Independence the XLVIII.

Elizabeth Gower all of my perishable property that I before  
leave unto my beloved wife to be equally divided between them  
four daughters by my executors if it can be done with out  
selling either wife if it cannot for the property to be sold by  
my executors and the money or value arising from such sale  
of property to be equally divided between the before named  
daughters and if either of my daughters should die without  
lawful heirs of her body then my desire is that the surviving  
sister should have the part equally divided among them  
I give the above named property to have these heirs and execu-  
tors for ever.

Item I leave unto my daughter Dorcas Ogletby the house and  
her plantation during of her life or widowhood.  
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Barnes  
Ninety Four Acres of land adjoining of Martha Bell on  
the west side also the peace or parcel of land that I bought  
of James Tuford lying on the east side of above bounds to  
him his heirs and assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath  
unto my son David Barnes the peace or parcel of land  
where he now lives with all his improvements thereon  
or appertaining also the peace or parcel of land on the  
east side of Thaddeus Brundt to him his heirs and assigns  
for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son  
Francis Barnes the peace or parcel of land where on  
I now live in including all improvements thereon  
the house and cleared ground and firewood and  
Pole timber to fence the ground of the less plantation  
that I leave unto my daughter Dorcas Ogletby during of her
