Ordered that Mr Secretary have notice that Letters Testamentary Issue accordingly.

I Joseph Robinson of North Carolina County of Beaufort being in good health & sound judgment do make this my last will and testament in form and manner following, that is to say first I give my soul to god who gave it to me, Nothing doubting but I shall the same at the final Resurrection and my body to be Buried at the Discretion of Executors.

Item I give to my well beloved wife Ann my Plantations whereon I now live together with all my houses both now dead during her widowhood.

Item I give to my son Allin Robinson two hundred Acres of Land beginning at a Pillentary near the Point to him and his heirs Lawfully begotten for ever, in Case the sd. Allin should die without heirs Lawfully begotten then to Return to my Daughters Grace & Ann's Shares to be Equally Divided. Item I give my Daughters Elizabeth Rounding Her life in the Land I give to her some Shewer Housing. Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Robinson one hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live beginning at a Pillentary near the Point from thence running a straight Course to my Corner Post near the head of Lemasse Creek, from thence along my head back to the bay, from thence down the Bay to the beginning, to the sd. Allin's Lawfully begotten, if she should die

without such Heirs then to my Daughter Grace and her heirs Lawfully begotten for ever.

Item I give to my son Allin & my Daughters Elizabeth Rounding Grace Robinson & Elizabeth Robinson all my moveable House hold goods & furniture after my Decease to be Equally Divided. Lastly I Nominate and appoint my well beloved wife Ann & my son Allin my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal, this Twenty second day of March 1766.
