or Parcel of land to ^{my} two Sons a for said being
the Land I Bought of Abraham Gaskill my
Wife's Except ~~the~~ being the Land Whean I now
Live one hundred and thirty acres.

I give to my two Sons a for said three head
of Horses I give to my Son Fullan one canoe
and one cow to my Son Fullan I give to my
Son Joseph the House he now Lives in and one
cow to my Son Joseph I give to my gran Son
Stephen the House I now Live in and one
Fether bed I give to my gran Son Stephen
and the furniture I give to my gran Son
Stephen one gon I give to my Daugh Mizegian
one Fether Bed and Furniture and one Christ
and one Hipper to my Daughter Mizegian I
give to my Daughter Loney one Hipper
the rest of my moveable Proptly to be Equall
ed & Wided between my two Daughters
I give to my Dauter Mizegian Fifty acres of
Land at the Thoroughfare

I give to my Daughter Loney Fifty acres
of Land at the Thoroughfare be it none
I Ensubing this to be my Last Will and Testament
given and done my hand &c.
