1st It is my will that all my just debts to be paid and what has bin please god help me with in this life, I dispose of as the following manner

2nd I give to my son Culpepper Piggott fifteen barrels of Corn for pay him for his work this year when he houses my Crop

3rd It is also my will that the balance of my Crop with my house and Kitchen furniture forming tools and my stock of live stock should be sold as to raised money to pay all my just debts & to pay for the lands where I now live the same has bin & my friend Elijah Piggott became the purchaser it is also my will that when he sees his money out of my estate that he give my Children a good & sufficient title to the land and the same to be equally divided between my Sons and Daughters

4th It also is my will that my right in the negroes belonging to the estate of my father John Shackson & should be valued and my Mother Eliza Shackson should have the disposal of them as if she don't choose to take them then it is my will that they should be sold according to law & the money applied as above & leave my friends Isacharias Piggott & Elijah Piggott my wife and the executors or working all other means by me at the time this 4th day of Aug 1835. Signed in the presence

My last will wishes and desires first and foremost to have all lawful debts settled and paid according to law which at the utmost is about 30 Dollars on accounts of which may be seen in the off side of new ledger in different specific accounts I wish all my personal property to be sold according to law and my wife Mahala to have in what articles she may want for her convenience and living which of course will be charged in the bill of sales.

2nd the House and lots of land together with the negro girl call I remain in possession of, My Wife Mahala My daughter Nancy Eliza daughter Sally Brown and my son John Brown as long as they shall live together without any change in the said family or unless such time as they may be of lawfull age and then or at soons after marriage I have the said property lawfully valued and divided into four equal divisions or lots and each draw his own lot of the next pounds of the aforesaid property to their own care and before each hair it is my further desire such of my family as may be living after my decease should live and stay together in the House and lots as the now stand as long as they can agree for the mutual love and support of each other and if one or more should by taken away from this life to have his portion equally divided amongst the remainder heirs, also if Negro girl said should have any young issue that may be raised to have the same also equally divided between the aforesaid heirs, and so ends this my last testament
