with every thing thereto belonging also all the personal
property of my own Consisting in what it may & also
part of the land that may belong to me, I do this to
better enable her to raise my several Children, after
the death of my wife my will and desire is that
what was property that may remain that is may
be equally divided among all of my Children in part
this is my last Will.

In the name of God Amen, I William S. Scarborough
of the Island of Beaufort County of Curtest and State of
North Carolina being very sick and weak in body though in
perfect mind and memory Calling to mind the mortality
of the body & knowing that it is now appointed for all men
to die do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament
to say first of all I recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God who give it nothing doubting at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again my body I
recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the direction of my Executors.

As to touching such worldly estate as God as him pleased
to bless me with in this world I give and bequeath
in the following manner. My I give and bequeath unto
my beloved Wife Mary Scarborough and singular my
whole estate Consisting of Houses, lands, Negroes,
Stock, Household Goods &c. to her natural use and benefit
in and during her Widowhood by her keeping my Children
and property together in order to support on the same
but should my Wife again be bound to marry it is my
wish and desire that all my property should be then
equally divided between my Wife & two Children then &
then about, my Wife claiming one third my Daughter
Mary and Anne one third & my Daughter Catherine one third
to be divided according to the Judgment of my executor
I also here and request that my beloved Wife Mary,
she & be and act as Executor to this my last Will and
Testament disavowing all others, declaring this & no other
to be my sole wish and desire
