

In the Name of God I Name I Nathan Davis
of the County of Carteret and State of North Carolina in
in a low state of health and infumbered with disease
and Infirmities of an advanced age. But of
Sound mind and memory, and knowing it is apprised
for all men once to die and that according to the laws
of nature my departure is fast approaching, and having
desire to prevent, so far as human foresight can
prevent; all these domestic disputes, dissensions and
animosities which may otherwise occur after my death
and to settle all my worldly affairs and to be ready
to attend the awful summons of death, I ordain and
appoint this my last will and Testament, and desire
it may be esteemed by all as such. —

First my body I commit to the Earth from whence it was
taken to be interred in a decent manner without ostentation
pomp or parade, at the discretion of my executors
Executors my soul I resign into the hands of whom
I hope again to receive it at the great and joyfull day
of the resurrection. —

as to my worldly goods and effects, such as remain
after all my just debts are paid I dispose of them in
Manner following my Impairment To my son
Isaiah Davis I give one Negro man named Brodie,
one Negro Woman named Barb and a Negro Girl named
Tab, and an aged Negro man named Simon and a
Negro woman named Sue, and one Master Bed. —

Item. To my son Freeman Davis I give one Negro
woman named Rose a Negro girl named Viola
and a Negro boy named Andrew and one named
Steph and a Negro girl named Bess, and one Master
Bed. —

Item. To my son James Davis I give one Negro man
named Pompey a Negro woman named Anna a Negro
girl named Jean a Negro boy named Sutton a
Negro boy named Peter and a Negro boy named Tom.

Item. To my Grand Daughter Betsy Shadley
I give a Negro girl named Lettice born of Violet
now in the possession of Stephen T. Ford Esq.
and to my other Grand Children of Molly Talpold
deceased I give the said Violet and her offspring
to be equally divided among them at the discretion
of their Father Stephen Talpold and I give also
the said Stephen Talpold twenty shillings in

gold and in gold also my Wall and chair is left my son-in-law
Stephen Talpold or the heirs of him the said Stephen and Molly
his wife shall be or they pay their Capital proportion which I
have nominated to be paid three years after my decease And
the other legatees hereafter mentioned are also to my Grand
Children of my Daughter Betsy Shadley I give forty pounds
in cash to be paid them in three years after my decease by my
Executors —

To my Grand Children the heirs of Anthony Davis except I give
forty pounds in cash to be paid them in three years after my
decease by my Executors provided the said heirs do not sue
for a certain house that was called their Father's — But if they
or any one for whom sue for the said house — then and in that
case I give them twenty shillings only — Item — to my
Daughter Elizabeth Jones I give during the term of her natural
life a negro woman named Cee and a negro boy of the said
Cee named Jack — and at her decease to descend Equally to
her children lawfully begotten of her body and fifty pounds
in cash to be paid her or her heirs in three years after my
decease by my Executors —

and there is a dispute or Law suit as or may be likely to
arise respecting the land I have given to my son Isaiah
Davis whereby he may lose it or if not — may be at once lost
in defending it — Now in that case I give him the half of a
Negro girl named Annie and the other half to my son
Isaiah — But should no suit arise respecting the said land
then and in that case I give the said Annie entirely to my son
Isaiah — and all of my property that is not already
given away my will is set aside my decease it shall be
equally divided between my three sons — Isaiah, Freeman and
James Davis — whom I nominate and appoint executors
to this my last will and Testament — and lastly I renounce
and disavow all former Wills by me made. —

In witness whereof I hereto set my
hand and seal — this 23 of July in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and one.

Item: I do hereby appoint my Cousin Rufus W. Davis, and my brother in law Benjamin F. Delany
Executors to this my last will & testament:

Item: To my will that all my lands should be sold,
and my right in the grist & saw mill, on Hunter's Creek.
The monies arising from such sales to be applied to the
payment of all my just debts, and the over plus to be
equally divided between my Cousin Rufus W. Davis,
and my brother in law Benjamin F. Delany.

Item: I hereby give and bequeath all my Books, less
& Furniture and effects to my sister Polly Delany

In testimony whereof I have hereunto
Subscribed my name & affixed my seal this 19th day
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty seven.

In the Name of God Amen I William Dennis son of Caswell County
in the State of North Carolina being say ever and last but of sound
and perfect mind and memory blessed be God, on the 27th day of
May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred thirty nine made
and published this my Last will and Testament in manner following that is
to say first all my just and lawful debts and funeral charges be
paid out of my estate by my executors

Item I lend unto my beloved wife Mary Dennis during her natural Life
My Land and plantation where now lies with all my plantation
Tools, also I lend unto my wife Mary Dennis my slave man named
Sam peacock, my Negro woman named Nancy, my Negro woman named
Peg, my dog named Sarah, my Negro woman named Hannah, my
Negro man named Abram, likewise I lend unto my wife Mary
Dennis for her support during her natural Life all my stock of
Cattle sheep and hog, and my house and all my house furniture,
all the above mentioned Land, Negroes, Stock and furniture I lend
unto my beloved wife Mary Dennis during her natural Life, and at
her Death to be divided among my children as hereafter mentioned

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Dennis one
half of the Land and plantation I bought of William Dennis
Taylor lying on Bogne Sound being the west part, also one third
of my Land lying on Gailes Creek, also I give and bequeath
unto my said son William Dennis my Negro man named Caleb,
my Negro girl called Letta, my Negro girl named Elizabeth
and my Negro girl called Abby to him his heirs and assigns
for ever, Nevertheless as I have heard and am informed that
my said son William Dennis say he has got a large account
against me, And if he the said William Dennis should
bring any account forward against my estate then and until
such I do hereby disannul the above gift of Land and Negroes
and it shall be null and void, and I give and bequeath unto my
said son William Dennis five Shillings Sterling money.

Item I give unto my son James Dennis one half of the Land which
he now lies on to be divided by a line of marked trees beginning
thirty yards to the Eastward from his fence at the said land,
and running the same course with his fence back to the back part
of said Land be the same one half more or less, also I give unto
my said son James Dennis my Negro man called Willard also
my Negro Girl called Letta the above Land and Negroes I
give and bequeath unto my said son James Dennis to him his
Heirs and assigns for ever,

Item I give unto my son Francis Dennis one half of my Land where the
most houses stand on the same beginning at James Dennis's begin
ning course on the back land being twelve rods to the East
