 were Goodwin to be sold at the death of my mother and
 the money to be Equally divided among all my children
 thirdly at the Expiration of my wife's widowhood
 I give all my property to be Equally divided among
 all my children both in Doves and out whereever
 the same may be found forthly and lastly I do
 nominate my three friends Wright Goodwin, Joseph
 Goodwin and Thomas Emmerly Executors To this
 my last will and testament where unto I have
 set my hand and seal this Twenty Eighth Day
 of February one thousand Eight hundred and
 Nineteen

In the name of the almighty God, amen, I John Barair of
 the Straits, Charlotte County, being sick in body, but of sound mind
 and understanding, sheweth be to the almighty God for the same,
 and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die, I make
 and constitute, this my last will and testament, in manner
 and form as follows:— In primis, I give and bequeath my
 soul, to the almighty God, from whom I received it, and my body
 to the earth, from whence it was made, to be buried after my
 decease, in a Christian like and decent manner, and hope
 at the resurrection to receive the same glorious and immortal
 and as touching such worldly goods and property, which it
 has pleased God to bestow on me, I dispose of the same
 in the following manner.

I Give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Miriam,
 the house and plantation whereon I now live, with all the
 other benefits annexed, to the same, during her natural life,
 I also give and bequeath unto my said loving wife, the use
 and profits of all my negroes that I have, or claim, and live
 with, all my household furniture, and stock of cattle,
 and hogs I give, unto my said wife during her natural life,
 and after her decease, it is my will that what remains of the
 above mentioned property be disposed of, in the following manner
 and to the following persons.

First, I give and bequeath unto my two loving sons James
 and Anson, all the lands that I hold or own on the Straits
 and Portmaneth banks situated on the Sheep Island, said
 lands to be equally divided between my said two sons
 James and Anson. I also ordain it as my last
 will and testament that all my negroes, household
 furniture cattle and hogs the use of all which I have
 given unto my loving wife during her life, after her decease
 or death that what remains of my said property in negroes,
 household furniture cattle and hogs that the same more or less
 be equally divided between my loving daughter, and where
 here, that is to say Nancy Davis, Esther Barcott,
 the childre of my daughter Polly Wells, Phoebe
 Fulford, Rebecca Davis, Clarissa Surges, Elizabeth
 Barcott, Dorcas Wade and Jane Wallace daughter
 of my son Valentine. I nominate and appoint
 my two sons James and Anson Barcott to be
 my executors to this my last will and testament
 and revoke and disannul all for wills or
 testaments made by me,
