I give unto my son Edward F. Carraway my house and plantation and any of the would have land to contain one hundred Acres provide he make A dead to fifty Acres of land lying and running throu my plantation on which I now live giving to him by his gran mother the Plantation name as the man place on which I formerly lived in case he say on Edward fails to comply with the condition of this my will then the house and land before mentioned shall go to my young children

Item 2 I give to my daughter Nancy the Balance of the same tract of land which is two hundred Acres I all so give her 3 cows and calves which she claims one Red & black and four nature. I give to my son Edw a negro male etc.

Item 3 I give to my son George F. Carraway the place of land on which he now lives Beginning at the mouth of the Black Creek I lay out running up the side gut and swamp to A mark gum thence so as to take in his house and brick kiln by the side of the bridge A strake line to the proccorn thence westwardly with the proccorn to the Seward Branch of Edwards Swamp thence with said Branch to the main swamp & thence down said Swamp and Creek to the Beginning containing one hundred Acres

I give unto him the Red which he now has in his possession Item 4 I give to my son Joseph F. Carraway A tract of land which he now lives on Beginning on the side of John Rans Creek at the mouth of a ditch running with the 2 bars of the ditch A strake line to the old common line thence with that line to A large pine mark thence a strake line to A mark gum just below the old road landing thence down the Creek to the Beginning containing one hundred Acres I give unto him the Red he has in possession

Item 5 I give to my Beloved wife and her children my house and plantation on which I now live and All of my lands not before mentioned my stock of every description household furniture Library to her my Beloved wife during her life

life to be divided between my children or such
one of them as shall survive of her death

I give to my son Benjamin L. Barroway my some
mill I draw her By Appointment and nominate my Beloved
wife Jennie Barroway Ecobrick and my son Edward F.
Barroway Executors to my will.
