Know all men by these presents that I Rebecca Madge of the town of Beaufort, County of Eastern and State of North Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, do hereby make, ordain, establish and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others. Item I do hereby lend unto my son John, during his life, and to his wife Jane during her widowhood, in case she should survive her husband, the Lot number one hundred and twenty six (176)^{O. 7.} and all the improvements thereon - together with all my household furniture and personal property of all kinds and descriptions whatsoever. And after the death of my son John - or the marriage of his wife Jane, in case she survives him - I give and bequeath unto his children William James and Francis Ann - and such other children as they may have while living together in the marriage state, the above named Lot No. 176, and improvements thereon - together with all my personal property above mentioned, to have and to hold the above mentioned real and personal estate, to them, their heirs and assigns forever. —

Judith Robinson of Portsmouth, County of Carter-
 et and State of North Carolina, being of sound
 mind and memory, but considering the un-
 certainty of my earthly existence, do make this
 my last will and testament in manner and
 form following; that is to say, First, that
 my Executor (hereinafter named) shall pay all
 my funeral expenses, together with my just debts,
 owing and to whomsoever owing out of the monies
 that may first come into his hands as a part
 of a parcel of my estate.

Item, I give and devise to all the children of
 my Brother Valentine Robinson my house and
 lot on Portsmouth where I now live, so as to include
 my dwelling house all out houses and other im-
 provements to all in equal proportion, share and
 here alike, to them and each and every one
 of them their Executors administrators and assigns
 absolutely forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Brother Benja-
 min and Joseph to each one fourth of my personal
 estate of negroes, goods chattels of what kind
 and nature soever to them their heirs and assigns
 forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to the children of my
 nephew William Robinson and to the children of
 James and Emeline Wallace the remaining half
 of my personal estate i.e. (that is) one fourth of my
 personal property to the children of William Robinson
 and one fourth of my personal property to the children
 of James and Emeline Wallace to them their heirs
 and assigns forever.

And lastly - I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my Brother Benjamin Robinson my lawful Executor
 of all intents and purposes to execute this my last
