Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Nancy all the Remains of my Property both Real and Personal of what kind or Nature it may be that Remains after all my Lawfull Debts be paid to her and her heirs for ever.

I Nominate and Appoint my Trusty and Worthy friend Stephen Fulford Junr to be Executor to this my last Will and Testament Wherefore I have set my hand and seal the Day and Date above Written

In the Name of god amen I Peter Brees of the State of North-Carolina and County of Currituck being sick and weak in Body but of sound and perfect Understanding mind and memory So make and ordain this my Last will and Testament and calling to mind

the Mortality of this Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I Recommend my Soul to god that first gave it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors and touching of my worldly goods where with it hath pleased god to Bless me I give and Dispose of in the following manner and form.

Item my will and Desire is that my Oxen and two three year old Steers and as many more of such Cattle as my wife has Best sport should be sold at public Vendue as will pay of all my Just Debt my will and Desire is that my house and Lands I hereby give to my Loving wife Maryan Brees during her natural Life or widowhood Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving wife Maryan my negro man Sam and all my Store of Hogs and all my Store of Cattle that is not sold to pay my debts during her natural Life or widowhood --

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving wife Maryan all my Beds and all my household furniture of Every kind during her natural Life or widowhood

But if my wife should marry then and in that case my will and Desire is that my wife Maryan should have and I give and Bequeath unto her and her heirs for ever one feather Bed and furniture one woolen wheel and Cards six pulley plates and four setting screws.

Item I give and Bequeath to Loving son Henry Brees all my Lands that lie on the west side of the Mill Branch with the field called gamms to him and his heirs for ever Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving son William Brees all that part of my Lands that lie on the East side of the great Branch the Branch that lie East from my house so known Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving son Peter Brees my manner house and plantation with all the land that joins the same from the Mill Branch west of my house to

the great Branch East of my house to show  
and there heirs for ever and my will and  
Desire is that the Division line between my  
son Henry and Ross should be the main Road  
as it now stands and that Henry should have  
all that part west of said Road where it crosses  
the head of the mill Branch and I hereby  
Annominate and appoint my worthy friend  
and Loving wife Executors to this my last  
will and Testament to wit John Roberts  
Thomas English and Mary Brees Executors  
to this my Last will and Testament and hereby  
Revoke and Disannul all other will or wills  
By me formerly made In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal in  
presants of  
this thirtieth Day of December

In the Name of God amen, I Malachi Bell of Carteret County  
in the State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind  
Blessed be God, do this 22nd day of September in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and three, Make and Publish  
this my Last Will and Testament in manner following that  
is to say.

First-

I lend unto my beloved wife Sarah Bell during her Natural  
Life my House and the Easternmost part of my plantation I  
now on to be divided by a line of marked trees, beginning at a  
mulberry tree marked for a corner standing on the bank head near  
and on the east side of a pond in my plantation which stream  
into the pond on the west side of my House I must live in  
thence running N. West meaning the same course of the stream  
belonging to Nancy Tullford to the back line of my land including  
all that part near and joining Nithunt Creek with all the  
Buildings thereon, the aforesaid Land and Buildings at the end  
of my Wife shall be the property of, and belong unto my son  
David Bell as hereafter mentioned, I likewise grant and  
give unto my wife free Liberty to make use of any timber for  
rails or fire wood for her own plantation or house use on  
any part of the tract of Land I now live on, I also lend unto  
my wife during her Natural Life the work and service of my  
Negro man named Cole, and at her Death the said Negro Cole  
to be the property of my Grand Daughter Nancy Tullford or here  
after mentioned, Likewise I lend unto my wife during her  
Natural Life the work and service of my Negro man named  
Slept and at her Death the said Negro Slept to be the prop-  
erty of my son Josiah Bell, I also lend unto my wife all my  
House hold Furniture except my Desk and looking Glass,  
I also lend unto my wife all my plantation tools my  
Covers and all my stock of breems of every kind for her support  
during her Natural Life, at her Death to be divided with  
my House hold Furniture (what then may be in being or  
found) among all my children both Sons and Daughters  
and my Grand Daughter Nancy Tullford and my wife,  
three sons, I also lend unto my wife Sarah Bell my  
Wind mill which is now building during her Natural  
Life and I give unto her all the money now in my House  
(belonging to me) to finish the said mill, but my four sons  
and my two Daughters and my Grand Daughter Nancy Tullford  
to have their grinding down toll free.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Bell all  
my Landfull right and title to four Negroes viz
