Second I leave unto my beloved wife Sarah Gammon and Plantation where I now live including all my lands that I possess with all privileges thereto belonging also the land here and my other property of every description for the purpose of supporting herself and my Children during her paternal life or widowhood by paying my funeral charges if my wife should marry in that case I leave my perishable property of every kind to be sold on equal terms between my wife and all my surviving Children also in case I leave her my home and one third of my plantation when I now live her life time and after her death to return to my Children -

Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Sarah Gammon and my just Elizabeth Gammon and Cornelius Canady my executors and administrators to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 10 day of February and thousand eight hundred and twenty four

State of North Carolina Eastern County May eight hundred and twenty six Now you that I William Davis of the County of said state aforesaid do make this my last will and testament to wit I give to my daughter Genny her lifetime the plantation that she and her husband David Gaskill now live on and at her death to be equely divided amongst her Children - I give to my son John W. Davis all the land to the North and eastward of my land in debt in cludin the eastward corner of my house and the eastward part of the plantation including the blackacre ridge - I give to my daughter Fanny the westward part of my house and plantation as far as to a line oak stake at the west corner of the fence -

I give to my son Rodmy the balance of my plantation in cludin of his house and plantation

I give to my daughter Sally that piece of land that she and her husband Isaac Lewis lived on as far as Rodmy Davis died -

I give to my son Thomas Davis Children all the lands that lie between my daughter Sally and Jordan Davis -

I give to my son Jordan Davis his plantation all the lands to the line of Benjamin Davis now - -

I give to my son Joseph twenty dollars to be paid equally by my Children I give to my three daughters Mary Genny and Sally each of them a feather bed as per -

I give to my daughter Fanny and Isaac and calf -

I give to my son John W. Davis one Cow and calf all the rest of my property to be sold and to be equely divided amongst all of my Children
