I now Live --- I also give to my three sons
David Brees William Brees & James Brees the
Whole of my Woodling Land belonging to this
Plantation I have all Ready given away to be
Equely Divided in quantity & quality Between
them three as it may join this Plantation
I also give to my three sons David, William & James
my New Surveys of Back Land to be Equely Divided
between them three David, William & James Brees
to them and their Heire for Ever ---
Item I gave to my Daughter Annay Brees fifty pounds
Lawful money of this st. to be paid to her at her
Marriage Day to be paid by the Executors administrators
or assigns to be paid out of the movable property
of my sd. Estate or at the Decese of my Loving wife
Sarah Brees or marriage or Ethern of them,
my will and Desire is that all the rest of my Estate
that is not all Ready given? Brees James Brees
and Annay Brees to them and their Heires for Ever
I now Nominat and appoint my friends my
Whole and Sole of my Estate as Executor my
Loving Wife Sarah Brees Executors and also
David Brees and David Russell my Executors in
Witness where of I have hereunto Set my Hand

In the Name of God Amen. This twenty second day of October
1798 I Solomon Bree of Blawc Creek in Bartlett County being
in a low State of health and weak in Body but of sound mind
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in
Manner following

That is I give all my Estate and interest after my
just debts are paid to be the equal property of my wife and
Children to be main in my wifes hands as long as she is able
to keep and provide for our two Children, without alienating
her right or diminishing the interest. If it should other-
wise happen my will and desire is that a three fold Division
may be made of the Cattle and other effects, the Children
share accertain'd and laid apart as their property for
their proper use.

And whereas a piece of land on the head of Harlow
Creek is intended for me and a deed to be made for the same
by Lewis Hales Esq. It is therefore my desire that a deed
may be made for the same to my son Owen and his heirs
reserving a right for my wife Huldah to live upon it during
her life time without interruption. Whereas if my wife
Huldah should quit the place it is my request that she
said land and improvements may be taken in possession
by my said son Owen or other wise or otherwise for the
use of him and his heirs.

And for the discharge of my just debts &c my will
is that such things as may be most conveniently Spent
out of my interest may be disposed of or made in
payment by a Candid and disinterested Valuation
for that purpose, and no part to be sold at public

Sale for the present Money. And it is my desire if it may be so, that my Childrens Share of the Cattle with their increase may be reserved for them undiminished. Recommending both my Children and Wife to the Blessing and Protection of Providence.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Abigail and my Brother James Bell Executors and Executor of this my last will and Testament. Retifying and Confirming the same the day & year above Written.

I also give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Hannah Daniels one shilling Sterling being her full part. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Elisabeth Hickman one shilling Sterling being her full part. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Baker one feather bed and bolster one Cow and her in brease. I also - - -

My will is that all my just Debts be paid, and Discharged then my will is all the Rest of my Estate which I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife shall be for her and my Children use During her life and then to be Equally Divided between my four youngest Children namely, John Baker, Nathan Baker, William Baker, Sarah Baker, and this I Acknowledge that this is my will Accounting all other hereby made by me and I do hereby Acknowledge that I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th Day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and ninety three 1793
