year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen
make and order this my last will and testament in writing
and form as follows viz.

First of all I give and devise unto my beloved wife Jane in
my house and plantation and all the house hold furniture
and movable property except things that I shall mention
this I give to her during her life and after her death I give
the house and plantation unto my beloved son William
and his wife also I give unto my son William Morse my
and one half of my Coopers tools and I give unto my daughter
Morse the other half of my Coopers tools and my little girl
I give unto my daughter Nancy Gresham five shillings per
the Executors being she has had her part before
after my beloved wife death I give all the movable property
that is not given away in this will to be Equally divided Am
ong all of my daughter Nancy Greshams children and myself my
Polly Simpson shall have an equal share with them

Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Jane Morse and my son
William Morse Executors to execute this my last will and testament
in witness whereunto I have here set my hand and seal this
and year above written.
