I give to my beloved wife Anna Ward one hundred dollars now and to my tree Margaret C Chadwick I give the sum of three hundred & and if this sum of three hundred dollars is found not to be sufficient to make her claim good I wish her claims to be made good out of any money that comes to hand and otherwise disposed off and I leave unto my beloved wife Anna Ward my Negro boy Joe for the time of years and if necessary for her to have him ten years longer. I also give to my beloved wife

Anna Ward my Cotton Gin this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1845.

To all known that I Thomas L Bell being weak of body but of sound and perfect memory do make and leave this my last will and Testament to this I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Elbert W Bell all my lands wherein I now live containing Two Hundred fifty five acres, one bed and furniture one third part of the entire cap at home, one cow and eight sheep. I also leave my Glad and materials to the care of Elbert & Amarah Bell one half to Elbert and the other half of the freight to Amarah and son Bell. I leave and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Rebecca Morton during her natural life and at her death to go to her children a certain tract of land containing One Hundred acres known by the name of the New & old Bell land but if the said Rebecca should be without any child then the said lands to return to my children in an equal ratio one bed of furniture

I also lend unto her, & also leave one Hundred & Fifty four Dollars in cash and Twenty Six Dollars notes to be equally divided between Mrs Rebecca & Eliza Bell. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved son Amariah Bell one tract of land containing one hundred acres wherein he now lives known as Rorden land one bed of furniture that is at his house I also leave my Hat to be sold when Robert & Amariah shall think most proper and one half of said Hat to be equally divided among my three sons.

I also lend unto my beloved son Ben Bell and unto his heirs one tract of land wherein he now resides containing thirty acres more or less, one Bed for dollars in cash for his Garrison one half the common stock of feeded where he now lives I also leave the pley place land to be sold or work on equal shares by all my children.

I also leave all the residue of my property to be sold at public sale and the proceeds arising therefrom to be equally divided among all my children in Rebecca Amariah and Eliza with this provision that Amariah and Eliza have the care of their children part to distribution to each of them as their needs may require.
