 lowing manner -

Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Haskell
 my Lows and improvements and one hundred and ten
 Acres of Land Lying as followeth Beginning at the mouth
 of the Creek where I now Live and Running up the Eastern
 prong of said Creek to my Dree from said Sandy road
 to the Base line and with the Base line to contain one hun-
 dred and ten acres and from the Strat Lane to my Ditch
 on the South and nor more

Item I give and bequith unto my daughter Susannah fifty
 acres of Land lying near Hall Bay.

Item I give and bequith after my decease unto Levrany
 Easter Absolom Abraham William Elias delilah Mann
 all my property Both Real and Personal to be Equally
 Divided among the above mentioned, and further appoint
 my sons William and David my Executors to this my last
 will and Testament and in witness hereof I have set
 my hand and seal this 5 day of August 1813

In the name of God Amen, The eighth day of June one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.

I Henry Kevin of Carlisle County & State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament; at the same time utterly revoking all former wills made by me, acknowledging this to be my last will and testament.

First I authorize my executor to see one tract of land of mine lying on the north west side of Hadesno Creek whereon William Watson now lives containing Two Hundred acres which will never fall from the Head man in my possession in any way he may think proper to the best advantage, also immediately after my death to proceed and see all my personal estate of every kind whatever.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Kevin one third of the amount of sales of the above land also one third of the amount of sales of the above mentioned personal estate, to her and her heirs for ever also one third part of all the money I may at my death have on hand & one third of all the money that is due me to her and her heirs forever. I also lend unto my loving wife Mary Kevin one third part of the plantation whereon I now live lying on Pettiford's Creek containing ninety acres her third to include the house & cleared land during her natural life.

Thirdly, after the death of my wife Mary Kevin I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Kevin the above mentioned plantation on Pettiford's Creek containing ninety acres to her and her heirs for ever, but should she die before she arrives to the age of twenty one or has an heir lawful of her body then I give and bequeath to Elijah Pappan son of Joshua Pappan and the above mentioned plantation to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to the daughter Nancy Kevin all the remaining part of the money arising from the sales of the aforesaid land and personal estate also the remaining part of the money I may have on hand and due me to her and her heirs forever, but should she die before she has a lawful heir of her body or arrives to the age of twenty one, then I will whatever money may be due her in the hands of her Guardian should be equally divided among the

heirs of Joshua Pappan namely Elizabeth Polly & Nancy & Joshua Pappan.

Fifthly, It is my wish and desire before my property is divided, that my executor should pay to a teacher himself for twelve months schooling of my daughter Elizabeth Bell the wife of Caleb Bell and that all my just debts should be paid & my executor satisfied for his trouble.

Lastly I wish my daughter Nancy to receive necessary schooling and to be taken care of out of what I have here bequeathed her. At the same time I do appoint my trusty friend Zachary Green Executor of this my last will & testament also Guardian to my said daughter Nancy Kevin.
