In the name of God Amen I Thomas Oglesbee of Carter County in
the State of North Carolina, being weak in body but of perfect mind and
memory and with thoughtful of death acknowledge this to be his
last will and Testament in witness whereof I have subscribed this
I commend my soul unto the hands of almighty God that gave it me
and my body to the Earth from whence it came.
I give and bequeath unto my son William Oglesbee twenty five
acres of land near where he now lives beginning at a oak stump
on the bank head on the sound and running East to the mouth of a good
and strong a North Course & East out to get the swamp land and about
West to the same distance as on the same and thence to the beginning.
also I give one hundred and seventy five acres of land where he formerly
lived: Twenty five acres of Land to be taken of the same piece on the east
most part of the land, also Ten Dollars to him and his heirs forever
and the half of a Cross cut said.
I give and bequeath to my son John Oglesbee one hundred acres
of Land joining the person also a small piece of land that he now lives
on the south side of hull Swamp running the course of the run of the
Swamp and the it branch to the fork and out the fork branch to the
outmost line and with the line to maple Swamp and down the side
of a Swamp to the line of Hull Swamp it being part of the old line and
part of a new survey, also Ten Dollars & the half of a Cross cut said
only reserving the use of a Saw for the rest of my young & sons.

I give and bequeath unto my son Abraham Oglesbee a piece of Land
containing seventy eight acres that I bought of John Dunn, also twenty
four acres of Land of the western part of what lying between William Oglesbee
line and William Oaks line and Ten Dollars, also a small parcel
near to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Oglesbee twenty five acres of
Land lying on the Sound Likewise eight dollars and one shilling.
also I give and bequeath to my son Long Oglesbee all the remainder
part of my Land that I have not given away already and the one half
of the Negro girl Rose and small parcel near known by the name of
fan and one sheet that I used to call mine.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne Allen one third part of a
Negro girl named Moll and eight dollars to her and her heirs forever.
I give and bequeath to my daughter Elisabeth Hibbs one third part
of a Negro girl named Moll also a feather bed I lend her after her
mother's decease and eight dollars to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Dorothy Fancher the one third
part of a Negro girl by name of Moll and eight dollars and feather bed
after her mother's decease to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Livvy Oglesbee one half a
Negro girl named Rose and one chair and yearling & one goat and
