**K**NOW all Men by these Presents, That Elizabeth Appleton,  
Benj. Cheney and Wm Thomas —  
are held and firmly bound unto the Governor and Commander in Chief of the  
said State, in the sum of five Hundred Dollars  
pounds, current money, to be paid to the said Alexander Martin Esq.  
or his successors, Governors or Commanders in Chief for the time being. To the  
which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors  
and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with  
our seals, and dated this 28th day of September —  
Anno Dom. 1790

**T**HE Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above bounden  
Elizabeth Appleton Administratrix of all and singular the Goods and  
Chattels, Rights and Credits of Benj. Appleton —  
deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the  
Goods and Chattels, Rights and Credits of the deceased, which have or shall come to the  
Hands, Knowledge or Possession of the said Elizabeth Appleton  
or into the Hands or Possession of any Person or Persons for  
and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the  
Secretary's Office, and one attested Copy thereof to the County Court, where Orders for  
Administration passed, within Ninety — Days after the Date of these Presents;  
and the said Goods, Chattels and Credits, of the deceased, at time of his Death, or which at  
any Time hereafter shall come into the Hands or Possession of the said Elizabeth  
Appleton — or into the Hands or Possession of any other Person  
or Persons, for her — do well and truly administer ac-  
cording to Law; and further do make or cause to be made, a true and just Account of  
said Administration, within Ninety — Days after  
the Date of these Presents; and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattels and  
Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrat Account (the same  
being first examined and allowed by the Governor and Council, Superior or County Court)  
shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the same shall become due,  
pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of the Act in that Case made and provided. And  
if it shall appear that any Will or Testament was made by the deceased, and the Executor or  
Executors therein named do exhibit the same into Court, making Request to have it allowed  
and approved of accordingly, if the said  
above bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Admini-  
stration (Approval of such Testament being first had and made in the said Court) then  
this Obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full Force and Virtue.
