In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Hornbuckle of the County of Caswell and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of sound & perfect mind and Memory do make Ordain and Establish this my Last Will and Testament in the following manner, first I Recommend my soul to God who gave it, trusting it will appear Justified at the Resurrection when Every Good Thought will be Reward and Desire my body to be decently laid in the Earth out of which it was taken at the Creation of my Estate by my Executors hereafter to be appointed and I hereby Dispose of my Goods which God hath has given me with in the following manner (which is to say)

First I Give to my beloved wife Nancy four Negroes (viz) Rob. Lanny John and Son. Two head of horses. Riding Saddle and Saddle. five Cows and calves, five head of Cattle, six killable Hogs and six small ones, one breeding Sow, also forty Barley corn and thirty Bushels of Wheat, a Thousand Weight of Pot. and one Hundred Weight of Cotton out of the ensuing crop also Two fides leather for and During his natural life and at his Death to be equally divided among my children Except the four Negroes two of which Rob. and Lanny who shall be at liberty to Work with any one of my children they think fit and to Anne eight Dollars a year for their labour as long as they live I also Give to my wife the land whereon I now live During her natural life

Secondly I Give to my son Richd. Hornbuckle one Hundred and Eighty Acres of Land whereon he now lives but when the same is taken off should it include any part of the houses I now live in. My wife shall not be interrupted in the enjoyment thereof During her life I also give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sally Windsor wife of Thomas Windsor thirty Acres of Land containing his Indented Land that I gave her I also give and Bequeath to my son Richd. Hornbuckle one Negro Boy known by the name of Simon I also give to my Daughter Elizabeth Hardin wife of James Hardin one Negro fellow known by the name of George likewise I give to my Daughter Susanah Windsor wife of John Windsor one Negro Boy called Hugh. Also I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sally Simpson wife of James Simpson one Negro Boy called Peter. I also will that the four Negroes John Hardin, shall be taken and there must pay all that is due him to the rest in proportion in proportion to the others. I also will and Bequeath to my son William Hornbuckle one Negro fellow known by the name of John after my Wife's Death. I also give to my Daughter Francis Rogers wife of William Rogers one Negro Boy called Lee, after my Wife's Death. I also Give and Bequeath to my son George Hornbuckle one Hundred pounds Virginia Currency, also to Nancy his wife of John Hardin one Hundred and Twenty pounds Virginia Money. I also Give to William Hardin, my Grandson, Ten pounds of Money. I also Give to my Wife, all Household and Kitchen furniture, with my Room and Dress, during her life. I also give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Windsor wife of Thomas Windsor, the Remainder of the Land whereon I now live after my Wife's Death, also the Land to be partitioned and should it amount to more than his part for him to pay to them, but are lacking as above mentioned. and Lastly I Recommend, Establish and appoint my beloved wife Nancy, my son Richard and son in Law James Simpson Executors of this my Last will and Testament, in Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal this 24th day of March 1799.
