Know all men by these presents that William a free & single man
Administrator of Cornelius Anglin Decd. of the County of Harnett
and State of North Carolina, do hereby constitute and appoint my
son James Anglin my lawful attorney to transact in my be-
half to sue and recover in my name all rights, titles and claims
that I may have to any lands lying in the State of Tennessee, and to
take all the legal & necessary steps to secure the same from all
persons who may claim any right or title to the same. And I do
authorize my said attorney to have all the privileges in as full
and ample a manner as I have myself and whatever he may do in
my behalf shall be as binding on me as if I was present and
given under my hand and seal this 13th of October A.D. 1797

State of North Carolina for divers good causes and considerations
me hereunto moving have made constituted and appointed this
my last will and Testament in the following Manner
Item first I give to my daughter Elizabeth her heirs &c
a Certain Negroe Woman Name Jane, a Horse saddle, Bridle
& leather Red now in her and her husband's possession
Next I Give to my daughter Martha a Negroe Girl Name
Peggy a Horse saddle, Bridle, leather Red and furniture
Next I give to my son Lige a Negroe boy Name Lewis
Next I Give to my son Moses a Negroe boy Name Edmund
Next I Give my son Aaron a Negroe Girl Name Fanny and
I will that all my other property & Estate consisting of Land
Negroes, Stock, Household furniture &c be Equally divided
between the Part of my sons to wit James, William, & Joseph
George John D. Elias & Ephraim Except my Negroe Man Anthony
who being not absolutely free, I will that he have liberty to have
his own free choice from time to time to serve which of my
Children he shall choose, and not to be confined to one
particular, but if He be treated by one to have free liberty
to go to an other as he shall think fit, and not to be sold
to any other person. In Testimony whereof I have set my hand
and seal this 18th day of April, 1798, A.D. Ninety three
1798, & I appoint John Windsor Richard Hornbuckle, & my
son William W. Smith Executors of this my last will & Testament
