To all people to whom these presents shall come, know ye that
I Duke Williams of the County of Rowell and State of North
Carolina, this day make constitute and appointed my
friend Pyre Harris now of the County and State aforesaid
(but who shortly intends to remove to the State of Virginia) and
by these presents doth make constitute and appoint him the aforesaid
Pyre Harris my true and lawful Attorney, and in my name
and for my use to ask, require, demand and receive all such
sum or sums of Money that are now due and owing to me by
any person or persons, in the aforesaid State of North Carolina; and on
behalf thereof to sue for, and by lawful ways and means
recover the same and on receipt thereof, in my name give sufficient
release and discharges therefor. And Moreover him the said
Pyre Harris as my lawful Attorney is by these presents specially
authorized and in my name empowered and for my use to ask, demand
and recover (wherever to be found) three Negro Slaves, that is to say
Sarah a Woman, about 25 years or thereabouts of age and Duke
a lad under that age, which three Negro Slaves were formerly the
property of a certain Cornelius Gentry, who removed from the County
but previous thereto by Virtue of a Judgment and Execution the
said three Slaves were sold at public sale by a lawful Officer
to satisfy the said Judgment and Execution in which sale I the
said Duke Williams became the purchaser) and on refusal to deliver
said Slaves to my said Attorney when in my name demanded to
constitute one or more suits for the recovery of said Slaves and
employ one or more Attorneys at Law to prosecute the said
suits, and give proper discharges in my name on the receipt
of said Slaves or either of them all which lawful Proceedings of
my said Attorney in and about the recovery of the aforesaid Money
and Slaves, I do by these presents Acknowledge and confirm.
