To all people to whom these presents shall come, know ye that
I Duke Williams of the County of Granville and State of North
Carolina, both this day made constituted and appointed my
friend Tyree Harris now of the County and State aforesaid
(but who shortly intends to remove to the State of Virginia) and
by these presents doth make constitute and appoint him the aforesaid
Tyree Harris, my true and lawful attorney, and in my name
and for my use to ask, require, demand and receive all such
sum or sums of Money that are now due and owing to me by
any person or persons, in the aforesaid State of Virginia; and on
non payment thereof to sue for, and by lawful ways and means
recover the same and on rectify things, in my name give sufficient
titles and discharges therefor. And moreover from the said
Tyree Harris as my lawful attorney is by these presents specially
authorized and in my name demanded and for my use to ask for
and demand (whereupon to be found) three Negroe Slaves, that is to say
Sarah a woman, Bob about fifteen or sixteen years of age and Duke
a lad under that age, which three Negroe Slaves were formerly the
property of a certain Cornelius Gaskey, who removes from the County
but previous thereto by virtue of a Judgment and Execution the
said three Slaves were sold at public sale by a lawful Officer
to satisfy the said Judgment and Execution, at which sale to the
said Duke Williams became the purchase, and on refusal to deliver
said Slave to my said Attorney when in my name demanded to
constitute one or more suits for the recovery of said Slaves and
employ one or more attorney at law to prosecute the said
suits, and our proper charges in my name on the receipt
of said Slaves or either of them all which lawful proceeding of
my said Attorney is had about the recovery of the aforesaid money
and Slaves, I do by these presents acknowledge and confirm,
