 State of North Carolina being in a low State of Body but
 in perfect mind Memory I praise God, for the same, do make
 constitute & ordain this & now after this to be my last will
 & Testament in form and manner following (Viz my
 will & desire is that all Lawfull debts be paid -

Item I bind to my beloved wife Catharine Farley my Land
 and plantation during her natural Life or widowhood &c
 I bind her my Slave ^{boy} Phill & her natural Life or widowhood
 Also I bind her Two Negroes viz Phill & her daughter ^{maid} Mary
 her natural Life. Also I bind her my Negro man &
 my Negro girl Lucy. Such times that my Daughter
 Martha comes of age. Also I give her one feather bed
 of Furniture at her own disposal -

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ruthanna Farley
 the above mentioned Land and plantation at the death
 of my wife or widowhood. Also I give & bequeath
 to her the above mentioned Negroes Phill & Lucy
 at such time she shall come of age. Also one
 feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ruthanna
 Farley the above mentioned Negro woman Phill &
 and her Daughter Melly and their increase at the
 death of my wife. To her and her heirs for ever. my will &
 Desire is that if my Daughter Ruthanna should die be-
 fore she comes of age the above mentioned Land & plantation
 to go to her. To my Two or others. John Farley & Mary Farley
 To Equal divides between them both. And my will is that
 sold and the money to be ^{divided} divided between my
 Brothers & Sisters and my Negro girl Lucy to my Son
 Mary Farley to her & her heirs for ever. Also the mentioned
 Negro woman Phill & her Daughter Melly to my beloved
 wife Catharine Farley to her & her heirs for ever
