- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Thomas One Shilling Currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Agnes Hogg One Shilling Currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my son Gideon Hogg One Shilling Currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Gideon one Shilling Currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Nelson One Shilling Currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Yates One Shilling Currency
