I shew, only in legal form. In the Name of God amen I Henry Davis of the County of Carroll and State of North Carolina being Sane and of legal Age and memory thanks be given to God, willing and desiring that the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is uncertain how long I shall live I do make and give in my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul in to the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate as I own as it has pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following manner to wit - First I give and bequeath to my Son Norman Davis my dear beloved wife all my house hold property and Home Cattle Hogs and Chickens and poultry and fowls eat to me or in every wise mine and the good Wights of all my lands to hold and enjoy during his Natural life his paying all Longfords debts and debts and within my neighborhood like a good Norman Davis my dear Son. Respecting my last Will and Testament, and her to pay unto each of my children his or her share of my debts and debts within one year after my death and if any of my Estate or property be left to my beloved wife I give the same to be divided amongst my sons and Daughters equally, and I do hereby utterly Disavow and annul all other Wills and Testaments, wills bequeaths and Executors by me in any wise before made Willed and bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in things wherein I have herein to let my hand and seal this 25th Day of October in the year of our Lord 1798 Signed Sealed Published, pronounced and subscribed by the said Henry Davis as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto Subscribed our Names

I William Haines of Newell County and State of North Carolina, being sick and Weak in Body, had of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God, calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die Do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament that is to say first of all I give and Recommend my last Brethren to the hands of Almightie God that gave it, and my Body I Recommend to the Earth

The 14th I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother Philip Thomas all my
 Primer Goods - I then 20th I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother
 John Thomas all my Negroes and all of my Property with my House - Land
 and also all Debts due me by bond or upon Account - also I appoint James
 and Wm. Williams & Moore and John Thomas to be my full Trust of this my last
 Will and Testament, and let hereby Matthew Brooke and discharged are
 and every other Will or Testament whatsoever heretofore made by me the
 said William Thomas, and do Declare this to be my last Will and
 Testament, and all and every Will or Conveyance or Conveyances
 heretofore by me made, are hereby made Void, and I do Declare this to be my
 last Will and Testament ~~and I do~~ In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this 17th April 1797.
