 other Will or Wills heretofore Made by me, I do constitute and
 Ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form
 following Viz. I Desire all my Just Debts to be paid by the
 profits of my Estate — Item I Give unto my beloved Wife
 Rebekah Waters one Hundred Acres of Land Including the Plantation
 whereon I now live, one Negro Woman named Moll, Two Feather
 beds and furniture, to her and her heirs forever — Item I Give
 unto my Daughter Susannah Killy one Bed and half Dozen
 pewter plates, and one horse to her and her heirs forever — Item
 I Give unto my Daughter Chloe Waters one feather bed and
 furniture to her and her heirs forever — Item I Give unto
 my nine Children Priscilla Harlow, Sarah Waters, James Waters
 Lydia Swade, Sarah Waters, Benjamin Waters, Kiziah Waters, Joseph
 Waters and Phoebe Goldsmith one Shilling a piece to him and
 their heirs forever — Item I Give the Balance of my Property
 to be equally divided ^{between} ~~amongst~~ my three Youngest Children
 Pearson Waters, Anna Waters and David Waters, and lastly I nominate
 and Appoint my beloved Wife Rebekah Waters and Isaac
 Killy to Execute this my last Will and Testament, In Witness
 Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
 this Twentieth day of September one Thousand seven Hundred
 and Ninety Nine

In the Name of God Amen, this 15th day of June in the
 year of our Lord one Thousand seven Hundred and Ninety Nine, I
 Daniel Randall, Sen. of the County of Caswell and State of North
 Carolina, being sick and weak in body but of sound Mind and
 Memory, Thank be given to Almighty God, and Calling to Mind
 the Mortality of my body and uncertainty of this life, do make and
 Ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following Manner
 and form — And first I speak my soul into the hands of Almighty
 God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be decently buried
 in a Christian Manner, and as for such worldly Goods as He hath
 pleased God to bless me with in this life, I bequeath to them in
 the following Manner — Imprimis I Give and bequeath to
 my son John Randall the Land and Plantation whereon I
 now live, containing one Hundred and forty one Acres, when
 he arrives to the Age of Twenty one Years, to him and his heirs
 and assigns forever, And if he dies without Age, then I leave the
 Land to Samuel, also five Pound Virginia Money, —
 Item I Give and bequeath to my son Nimrod Randall my bed which
 I sleep on, also three Pound Virginia Money, to him his heirs and
 assigns forever —
 Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Randall one
 feather bed and furniture, called her bed, and one half of the pewter
 belonging to the House and now given to her and her heirs forever —
 Item I Give to my Wellbeloved Wife Mary Randall all the residue
 of my estate during her Widowhood, but be it remembered that
 that should my Wife Marry, that then the estate hereby given to
 her shall be equally divided ^{between} ~~amongst~~ Samuel Randall and my son
 Nimrod — It is my wish and Desire that if after my death
 my Wife dies before my Young Children come at Age that
 Robert my son should take his share John and raise him
 and that William should take Nimrod and raise him to Age —
 Lastly I constitute Ordain and Appoint my beloved son James
 Randall and my son-in-law, William Dipe Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke and Make Void
 all other Will or Wills heretofore by me made ratifying and
 Confirming this only to be my last Will and Testament.

be my special Attorney, to ask sue for demands and receive from
any Person or Persons Office or Offices within the United States or
of the United States any Sum or Sums of Money or Certificates or
any Land or Lands or other real or personal estate of what kind
or Nature soever which I am or may be entitled to as a Widow
and a Legatee of my late Husband Henry Dixon deceased
for services done and performed in the last American War
or any other manner, and further to do and execute all and
every such acts and things, tending to the recovery of any estate
and Right as aforesaid. Either real or personal, and to give
discharges for the same — I do hereby give and
grant unto my said Attorney full and whole power and
Authority in my Name, Seal and place to make and conclude
with any Person or Persons any Agreement whatever touching
the premises with full power and Authority to convey and
transfer the same in as full and ample a manner as I
myself could do in my own person to the only proper
use and benefit of the said Nathaniel Williams Junr. my
Attorney, his Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns
forever, and I do and will ratify, whatever my said Attorney
shall or may lawfully do in pursuance of these presents, In
