Carter in pursuance to an order of said County Board of Caswell made the 24th day of July 1798 and agreeable to the directions of the Act of said Board. Specifically in that case made and provided doth put place and bind unto the said Geo. Samuel, Fanny Morrow, an Orphan now of the age of five years last born 7th day. Untill she shall attain to the full age of eighteen years. during all which time the said Master faithfully shall receive her lawful commands every where gladly she shall not at any time absent herself from her said Master's service without leave. But in all things as a good and faithful servant she shall behave towards her said Master. And the said Geo. Samuel doth covenant promise and agree to with the said J. A. Carter that he will teach and instruct or cause to be taught & instructed the said Fanny Morrow to read and write according to Law.
