

# January Court 1799.

Be it known to all men by these presents that I David Hart, of the County of Carroll & State of North Carolina am held & firmly bound unto George Sims of the County & State aforesaid my just & full sum of Two Hundred and Fifty pounds North Carolina currency, for the sum performance of which I bind myself my heirs & executors, administrators, or assigns firmly by these presents sealed with my seal and Dated this Twentieth day of January 1789 —

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bounden David Hart his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns shall make or cause to be made to the said George Sims his heirs or assigns a good and Lawful Due & £ Two hundred & Twenty three Acre of Land, Including the plantation whereon the said Sims now lives and bounded as following To wit, Beginning at a white oak corner of John Rawls & running North 10 Degrees East 190 poles to a white oak near Linkepin Branch, thence North 40 Degrees East 74 poles to a Box oak on Davis path thence East 152 poles to a Box oak on Jacobs Line, thence South with his line 178 poles to a Stake corner of King's, then west to the first Station, Then the above obligation to be void or otherwise to remain in full force & power and virtue.

AGREABLE. To an Order of Carroll (October) County 1798 we have attested to Sarah Brown widow & wife of John Brown Deed so much of the Stock Provin<sup>er</sup> &c as we suppose will be sufficient for the Family's maintenance for one year. That is

48 Bushels of Corn, 10 Bushels of Wheat  
1500 " Pork Gross, 1 Mana<sup>er</sup> Caw  
2 Kill Cows, 1 Mana<sup>er</sup> man  
20 feet Tarp filled with Shucks  
and 1000 " Blades.
