By it known to all men by this presents that I David Hart, of the County of Curwitt & State of North Carolina, am indebted to George Sims of the County & State of said North Carolina, for the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty pounds North Carolina Currency, for the sum of which I bind myself my heirs, Executors, Administrators, or assigns firmly by these presents, Sealed with my seal and Dated this Thirtieth day of Jan^y 1789 —

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bounden David Hart his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns, shall well & truly make or cause to be made to the said George Sims his heirs or assigns a good and lawful Debt of Two hundred & Twenty three Acres of Land, including the plantation whereon the said Sims now lives and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at a white oak corner of John Pawlicks running North 10 Degrees East 190 poles to a white oak near Turkeypen Branch, Thence North 40 Degrees East 74 poles to a Box Oak on Hart's path Thence East 152 poles to a Box Oak on Gault's Line, Thence South with his Line 178 poles to a Stake corner of Kings, then west to the first Station, Then the above obligation to be void or otherwise to remain in full force & power and Virtue

Williams Son & Son of the Subscribing Witness be admitted to come forward, & from the hand writing of David Hart and who shall swear that the Signature to this Bond was truly his being the hand writing of David Hart Whereupon it was Ordered to be recorded

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Agreeable to an order of Curwitt (October) Court 1798, we have allotted to Sarah Brown Widow & Heir of John Brown Dec^d so much of the Black Provision as we suppose will be sufficient for the Family's maintenance for one year. (That is)

48 Barrels of Corn, 10 Bushels of Wheat
 1500^{lb} Pork Hops, 1 Man's Law
 2 Hides Cows, 1 old mare
 20 feet Taps filled with Shucks
 and 1000^{lb} Blades.
