A true Inventory of the Estate of James Long, dec'd.

Five Head of Hogs, thirteen head of Cattle, fourteen head of sheep  
fifteen head of hogs, one Mutton and Hares, Two Barbecue plow, four  
Dutch plow, hogs, two pair of chains, two pair of Halk Chains, two  
pair of Swinglathes, four Chalks, three Mallets, four Hoes, three  
axes, one Cattle plow, two blind bridles, four wheelbits, four  
Bells, one Hand saw, four Augers, one Gauge, one Drawingknife, one  
Paw, one foot Aze, two Iron Mallets, two pitch forks, two Clathcocks  
one Shade, one Carry Comb, two feather bed and furniture, two  
pair of boots, one Corner Cupboard, two Table, one Chair, one  
Trunk, four Chairs, two glass Urn, one Cotton Wheel, one Gage, one  
one Corn, three pots, one Basket, one Shovel, two pair of footstools,  
one Iron potrack, seven plates, two Dishes, three Basins, seven  
strong Cans of knives and forks, two pitch forks, one pair of handbands  
one Mang Ladder, one Riddle, one flat Iron, one Shovel, one pair of  
Hatchets, eight Harrow teeth, two Cow Hides, two Meat kettles, one

Wm. Murphy, Secy

In the name of God Amen, I John Croset, of the County of  
Leaswell and State of North Carolina, being Weak in body, but of sound and  
perfect Mind and Memory, and Calling to Mind the Mortality of my  
Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die, I  
do hereby make and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament  
to wit, I do hereby give and recommend my soul unto  
the hands of Almighty God that Gave it, and my Body I recommend  
to the Earth to be buried in a secret and Christian manner at the  
discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting but at the general  
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power  
of God; And as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith I hath  
pleased God to bless me with in this life I Give, Dispose and dispose  
of in the following Manner To wit — I Give and bequeath  
unto my wife Rebecca with all my property, one hundred acres of  
land, one Horse, one Cattle, four head of sheep and  
two head of Hogs and eleven Cows, and all tools and householdings  
to be kept the land with and all my household furniture —

I Give and bequeath to my son William one smooth Gun  
I Give and bequeath to the rest of my children namely  
Charles, Margaret, James, Isaac, Elizabeth and the young child  
they are to get ten shillings a piece as ~~the same~~ they come of  
age.

I Give and lastly my will is that my loving Wife Isaac and Margaret  
Gives be Executors of this my last will and Testament, In Witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22<sup>nd</sup>  
day of October 1795
