- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Thomas One Shilling currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Agnes Hogg One Shilling currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my son Gideon Hogg One Shilling currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Gideon one Shilling currency
- Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Nelson One Shilling currency
