 and Commonwealth of Virginia (for divers good causes me hereunto
 moving have made certain constitute and appointed and by these
 presents do make certain constitute and appoint my trusty friend
 Andrew Ferguson my true and lawful attorney for me and in my
 name to make a deed of conveyance for a certain tract of land
 containing 100 Acres be the same more or less Situate and being in
 Gallatin County in the Commonwealth aforesaid Having and leg-
 ally presents granting to my Attorney my seal and full power
 and authority to make, sign, seal, deliver, and acknowledge
 a deed of conveyance for the said tract of Land unto William Brown
 the said Andrew Ferguson. And further for the said Andrew
 Ferguson to do perform and execute for me and in my name
 all and singular thing or things which shall or may be necessary touching
 and concerning the Premises as fully thoroughly and entirely as the
 said Joseph McKnight in my own person might or could do in and
 about the same ratifying allowing and confirming whatsoever my
 said Attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done in and about
 the execution of the Premises by virtue of these presents In Witness
