First I recommend my Soul to God, hoping thro' the merits of my beloved Lord to obtain a passage to all my dear and an Inheritance amongst the blessed above. Secondly I commit my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my surviving friends, and as for what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Walker all my House Lands, Behaves, Household Furniture, Hides, Horses and Cattle and all my property during her natural Life, and when it shall please God to separate her Soul from her Body, her body decently laid in the Earth, what property may then be found I leave and dispose of in the following manner, Viz. I will bequeath to my two beloved Grand Sons Sam^l Walker & James Walker, the share that I now live upon, containing two hundred Acres be the same more or less, together with all my former Orchard, Meadows, Mills, Woods, & Water Courses to be equally divided between them to them & their heirs forever. Secondly, the other property that may be found I will bequeath in the following manner, the profits I claim to be sold & the money divided among my three beloved Children, my Wife & Children, in that my beloved Daughter Elizabeth & my Daughter Jane being my beloved Son James Walker may have a double part to what my other two beloved Daughters may have. Thirdly, I desire that Robert King & James Walker my Son be my sole Executors of this my last Will
