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Stewart Parley of Caswell County and State of a North Carolina being in a Low State of Health last of, Parted from his dear and dear wife and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, Do hereby make & Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, as to my worldly Estate, which it has pleased Almighty God to bless me with, (Hem)

I Give to my beloved Wife Mary Parley, all the Goods & Chattels Lands and Tenements which I now possess during her natural life or Widowhood, and after her Death to be divided as follows.

(Hem) I Give to my Son Nehemiah Parley the Tract of Land that I now live on to him and his heirs for ever, (Hem) I Give to John Burton one Negro Man Sam? Bobb. One Negro Man Sam? Dick and one Negro Woman Sam? Lall. to him and his heirs for ever (Hem) I Give to Henry Burton one Negro Girl Nam? Lydia to him his heirs for ever (Hem) I Desire that all the Remaining part of my Estate be sold, and after all my Just Debts are Discharged, then the Balance of the money arising from the sale to be equally divided between Daniel S Parley - Nehemiah Parley, John Burton & Henry Burton, Lastly I constitute Nominate and appoint Daniel S Parley, John Burton & Nehemiah Parley Executors to this my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21st Day of March 1798

In the Name of God amen I Benjamin Shotton of the County of Caswell State of a North Carolina being through the mercy of God in a Low State of Health, but in Sound disposing Memory knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, I humbly give my soul to God that gave it to me and my body to the Earth from Whence it came to be Buried at the discretion of my Executor in a Decent Christian manner, not Trusting but in the General Resurrection they will Reunite by the mighty power of god. (Hem) I Dispose of What it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life in the following manner, Thus after my Just Debts are Paid which is my Desire I Ordain my dear beloved Wife Rebeckah Shotton my sole and sole Execut^{rix}, I Give to my Son Leonard Shotton five Shillings, I Give to my beloved wife during her life or Widowhood all my personal and Real Estate and at her Death to Return to my Son Leonard
