

October Court 1794.

In the Name of God Amen I John Reid of the County of Caswell and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but of perfect mind and memory, and knowing it is abominated for all men Once to die, do give my body to the dust to be buried in a Christian like form at the discretion of my Executors. My soul to God who gave it hoping to receive the same again in Glory at the Resurrection of the last day. And as to my Worlthy Estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I Give, Devise and bequeath in the following manner Viz^t Item, I Give and bequeath to my Beloved Wife Sarah Reid One Sorrell Horse, two Cows &c their yearlings Viz^t One large Red Cow with a White face & black the other white Cow & three bulls also I Give to her two Ploughs two Burring hoes, an ax and a grubbing hoe during her natural life. Also three Potts and Dutch Cobn, a Dozen Pewter plates half a dozen knives and forks, four basins, three bottles two jugs two hair pot hooks all my Stock of Hogs a Cwe and Lamb and all my Crop of Corn &c a bedstead Bed and furniture five Chairs, I Give during her Natural life, —

I Black Cow with a Mottly face two yearlings and a Hifler a little Red Cow, a Spotted Pump about four years old and a White Horse. I Will to be sold by my Executors to Discharge my Debt, the overplus with eight Silver Dollars due me by John Hale I Give to my two Nephews William and John Reid and John Reids son Simon to be put out to Interest for their use Equally with all the remainder of my Estate at my Wifes Death. Proceeded my said wife is not worth Larded is she to Child to inherit the whole of my said Estate, at her Death at the Rent of my Estate Viz^t a side saddle a Cotton Wheel two pair of Cards a place wheel a pair of Flat Irons two Water pails four brackets two little and two big ones a pitched a basket and Table my Riding Bridle and one of Rob Drakes I Give to my said Wife as her Lord. Also my Weaving and Other, I Give to my said Wife to be disposed at her pleasure. Also to be sold one pair of Horn brass my Riding Saddle and four Bridles to be sold Also a Cotton Gun Iron rollers, One Little Shot Gun to be sold for the purpose above mentioned.

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Except what my Executors thinks necessary my said Wife to have to purchase Hatt with her Also she to have a Grinding Stone to a piece of as she pleases

Imprimis I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Sarah Reid my Brother Nath. Reid and Brother William Reid Execs of this my last Will and Testament pronounced published & declared this 13th day of October in the year of our Lord

In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Simmons of Caswell County and State of North Carolina, knowing the certainty of Death &c Being very weak in body but having my perfect sense and reason do make this my last Will & Testament, and as Deseching such Worlthy estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I dispose of the same as follows.

Item, I Give to my Dear Wife Priscilla my Plantation with one hundred and fifty seven Acres of Land, the Plantation Tools, one third of the Stock, one third part of the Household furniture, Also five Negroes to wit, Fillis, Fanny, Tom, Rachael & Sable, her my Dear Wife to have and to hold her lifetime, and at her death the Negroes to be Praised and equally Divided among all my Children.

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That is to say Martha and Priscilla to have their part paid them in money by the other Legatees, who has the Negroes.

Item I leave Mrs Lucy, Miller, Dilsey, young Lucy & Rubin at my Death to be valued and equally Divided.

amongst Hannah Graves, Martha, Priscilla, Kajah Sarah, and Thomas and for Martha & Priscilla to have their parts paid them in money by the other Legatees.

Item I leave to my son Alexander One hundred and Twenty acres of Land lying in the South East corner of my Survey including a Spring and part of the Cleared Land, One Negro boy named Aaron The feather bed and furniture One Horse named Little Boy, Bol. One Cow and Calf and two Chairs, Saddle and Bridle to be kept in the Possession of my wife during her life in case he stands not a Harry and at her Death the Boy hired and the Land Rented for his Support and if he die without Heir the Land to return to his Brother Thomas and the rest of his estate to be equally Divided amongst all his Sisters & Brothers.

Item I give to my son Thomas One hundred and fifty seven acres of land with the Plantation &c after the Death of my wife, in case he should want I give him liberty to cut his clear not Interfering with his Mother her life time also one Negro boy named Sam. One feather bed and furniture, one Cow and Calf two Chairs to him and his heirs forever. And I do hereby revoke all and make void all other Wills heretofore made by me and pronounced this to be my Last Will and Testament. I Appoint Thomas Graves and my son Thomas Simmons the Executors of this my last Will and Testament's Intestacy whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of October 1794 —
