To all persons to whom these presents may come, know ye that I Simon Dixon of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, do hereby constitute and assign my Brother Charles Dixon of the aforesaid State and County, my true and lawful Attorney, (in fact, to make do and execute, Dies on Dies, of conveyances to Myra Dixon acquire, his certain attorney, his heirs, Exors, Adors or assigns for one certain tract or parcel of land, in the aforesaid County, on Hogan's Creek, being the tract whereon I lately resided, containing six hundred and forty acres, being the land given me by my father, also one tract of one hundred and fifty acres, adjoining the aforesaid, which I purchased of Mr. Sam. Dalton, also one tract of twenty four acres, adjoining Gallons and being originally a part of the same, and which I purchased of Oliver Perry, also one tract of twenty three and one half acres adjoining the said Gallons tract which I purchased of Peter Smith Roundhill, and one other tract of ten acres and an half, lying adjoining Charles Dixons tract which I bought of Capt. Nathaniel Dickinson, and any or all such conveyances by my said Attorney to make, I do hereby make binding on me and oblige myself hereby fully to confirm and make binding on me, my heirs, Exors, Adors and assigns, in as full and ample a manner, as though I myself in my own person had made and executed the said Dies on Dies, and thereby convey all the Interest, that I myself my heirs, Exors, Adors or may have therein In full Simple, In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of November 1796.
