I, Henry Davis of the County of Caswell and State of North Carolina Planter livingerry well and weak in, or in perfect little of body, but sound of spirit, mind and memory, make & give to god, setting aside the Mortality of my body, and knowing that it is also for a certain time to come, to make and subscribe to my last Will & Testament, that is to say, principally and partly, of all I give and possess and my health in to the hand of Almighty God, who gave it, and my body, I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in New Brighton Cemetery at the Discretion of my Executors, setting aside the general Reservation I make herein, the same again by publishing such at the general Reservation, I make herein, the same again by the majority power of god, and as touching such North Estate wherewithal it has pleased god to help me in this life, I give and devise of the same in the following manner, down. First, I give and bequeath to my son, James Davis my dearly beloved wife, all my house, lots, property and slaves, cattle, hogs and sheep, and poultry, and cattle, out to me or in every wise mine and the good right of all my lands to her and myself, during his natural life, his having all his cattle, and estate, and Britain's neighborhood wife, a very Norman Davis, my dear son, of this my last Will and Testament, and her to pay and back of my debts, less my daughter's debts, standing within one year after my death, and if any of my debts or property be left to my beloved wife, except the same to be divided amongst my sons and daughters equally, and they hereby utterly discharge and release all and every other former Testament, wills, bequests and testaments by me in anywise before made written and unwritten, publishing and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of October in the year of our Lord 1799, signed sealed, published, pronounced and confirmed by the said Henry Davis as his last will and Testament, in the presence of us, wherein his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names.

In the Name of God Amen I Henry Davis of the County and State of North Carolina being sick and Weak in Body, but of perfect mind and memory make be given to God, setting aside the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament, that is to say first of all I give and Devise to my last friends the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth.

Then 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother Philip Thomas all my Property Park. 2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother John Thomas all my Kingdoms and all of my Property with my horse, Land and also all Dells etc me by bond or open Account, also I bequeath to my Louis William Moore and his Family to be my good part of this my last Will and Testament, and also hereby disallow Provisions and every other little or Testament whatever written made by me the said William Moore, and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament, and all and every other bequest or conveyance or whatsoever by me made, are hereby made void, and I do declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have here to set my hand and seal this 17th April 1793.
